“Creation of Work Republicans’ Aim” Says Baldwin Here

Governor Receives an Enthusiastic Reception at Local Rally Attended by 600; Says Training of Youth Important; Other Speakers.

The major Republican rally in Manchester was preceded by a cavalcade of tooting horns and flaring red fire that gave volume about town a last-minute reminder that Governor Baldwin and members of his ticket were in town for the evening. Returning to the Temple the paraders found they had to get almost twice as many chairs as were available and the large harvest hall was quickly filled.
