How Election Viewed In Foreign Countries

Seen Blow at Hitler

London, Nov. 6—(P)— London newspapers today hailed President Roosevelt's lead for re-election as a blow at Adolf Hitler and welcome news for Britain.

An editorial in The Evening Star said "All the influence which Hitler was able to bring to bear was thrown against him (Roosevelt)," and added:

"We heartily welcome the American decision. Germany cannot mistake its implications. It is one of a growing number of signs that the tide is setting against tyranny and will finally enguif it."

He expressed soms doubt, however, whether the election signified general approval of Roosevelt's Far Eastern program, which he said was only one among many foreign and domestic problems.

A Roosevelt victory generally had been expected, but the election trend nevertheless brought expressions of misgivings that it meant a strong go-ahead signal for all Roosevelt policies, including measures against Japan.

Unofficial quarters said they expected a stiffened Oriental policy by Washington to show itself quickly, but they declined to speculate on its possible shape.
