Radio Day by Eastern Standard Time

New York, Nov. 8.—Political broadcasting in the 1940 campaign cost Democrats and Republicans a little more than \$1,500,000 for network time alone, according to figures just revealed by CBS and MBS. This does not take into account amounts spent in local stations in various parts of the country, which, when compiled, may add a million or more.

The Democrats were somewhat ahead in the network's figures, their total being around \$811,500, divided NBC \$320,000, CBS \$310,300 and MBS \$181,000. The Republican total was about \$692,500, of which \$293,000 went to NBC, \$274,000 to CBS and \$125,000 to MBS. While the Republicans used a few more hours than the Democrats, the sum they spent was not as great inasmuch as their schedule included a number of daytime periods which are not as expensive as at night.

Other parties bought around \$25,000 additional network time. The Socialists spending, approximately \$17,000 and the Socialist Labor party about \$6,500.


