### Nazis Using Air Fleet In Counter-Blockade

Britain Finding Difficulty Increasing in Maintaining Own Blockade of Germany.

By Devon Francis Editor Associated Press Aviation Editor

New York, Nov. 13.—Nazi Germany, which has hitherto so heavily and frequently so successfully on its air power, apparently is using its warplane fleet to tighten up its counter-blockade on England in a race for victory through starvation.

The air war on commercial shipping has a curious by-product. Many thousands of tons of shipping—the Germans say—have been sunk by Nazi air attacks. The biggest single merchantman loss the British have sustained, the 42,348-ton Empress of Britain, was due to a disabling air attack. She was disabled off a torpedo, and later sunk alone accounted for the sinking of the 16,437-ton Lancastria.

Last Friday Berlin said stocks of British shipping had been cut to one day.

The by-product is the increasing difficulty which Britain is finding in maintaining its own blockade. Ever since the completion of the Nazi campaign in Norway, British Naval vessels have been wary of enemy warplanes.

They withdrew the cork from the North Sea shipping lanes and backed out of range of German bombers.

In the area of the English Channel and the French coast they remained in a respectful distance from units of the land-based German Air Force.

The threat of air attacks, coupled with the increased loss of the German-held continental coastline, is sorely trying the ability of the British fleet to make its blockade leapfrog and cope with enemy air and sea raiders.

Submarine and surface raiders appear to have accounted for the bulk of the huge British merchant tonnage lost since the start of the war.

Keep Up Intermittent Attacks

But ever since that day, a year ago this month, the German planes have been attacking the British with missiles, the Nazis have been attacking on both British merchant ships and units of the British Navy.

Air attacks on shipping were stepped up by the Germans in December, were further intensified in February and in April, and what was described in London as a 24-hour phase.

Just how effective German aerial mine-laying tactics are, remains a problem, until the history of this war is written.

The campaign is not unique. The British as well as the Germans are using planes against enemy merchant and naval ships.

On Oct. 24 a British communique "torpedoed" two German supply ships in the North Sea.

Nazi Airplane More Cautious

For their part, Nazi air forces have become more cautious in their attacks on manned units of the British fleet. Soon after the start of the war, air production for the fleet and anti-aircraft fire repelled several such attacks.

Not since last March have the Germans attempted a mass raid on a British Naval base. That raid, lasting an hour and 25 minutes at Scapa Flow, damaged—so the Nazis reported—a battleship and a cruiser.

Better defense, however, has not kept the Germans from attempting lightning and sometimes successful assaults on merchant ships, on destroyers and light cruisers, several of which have been sent to the bottom.

## Knights of Middle Ages Were Not So Chivalrous

ROMANTIC writers have created a glamorous picture of the Middle Ages when knighthood was at the height of its glory. Danzig, now part of greater Germany, has used three knights, in full armor, in the design of the stamp above, one of a series celebrating the reunion of Danzig and Prussia.

History is not so kind to the age of chivalry as novelists. War was a bloody business then, as now, and the knights were little more than a glorified standing army, generally looking for trouble and finding it.

While the knightly code attempted to make religion a greater force in daily life, the later Puritans succeeded better. Women were supposed to be held in high regard; actually, modern men have more consideration of women than the heroes of the Round Table. The educated classes of 1940 far surpass the average medieval knight in discipline, self-control and personal refinement.

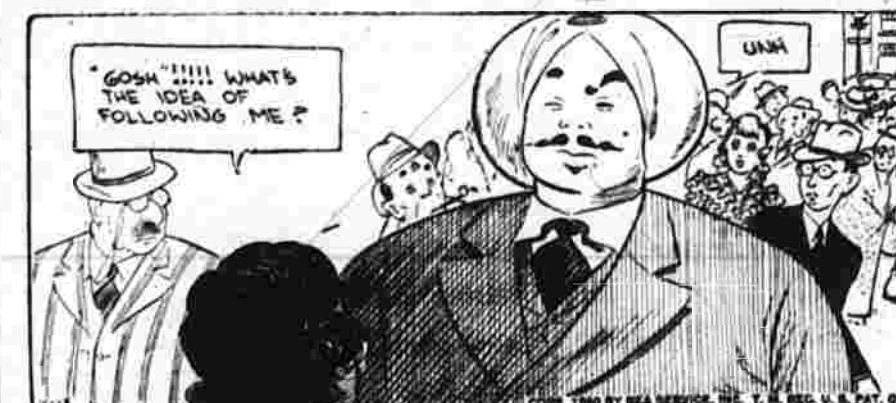

### Doctors Must Shoulder Drive Against Syphilis

Cleveland—(AP)—A specialist in venereal diseases declared recently that individual doctors everywhere must shoulder the burden of the campaign against syphilis. "Two-thirds to four-fifths of all practitioners, and only the smaller percentage in clinics," Dr. Victor C. Laughlin of Cleveland informed the American Institute of Homosexuality, in 96th annual meeting.

"We hear strange tales from patients who are forced to travel in pursuit of their jobs. These individuals see a variety of doctors in the course of a month, and their experiences are little short of blood-curdling.

"Against Carry Own Needle—Many of these patients are forced to carry their own needles, syringes and drugs as a safety precaution. If we can believe them, in some instances they actually show the doctor how to sterilize the syringe and needle and prepare the treatment.

"Syphilis will never be controlled under such circumstances. The great weakness in treatment, said, is the failure of patients to return for the proper amount of treatment. Many go away feeling improved, only to find the disease crop out years later in its more virulent form.

"Patients who are hurt are prone to give up treatments," he observed. "Discomfort and un-

### Coughing May Spread Cancer

Local Infections May Be Thrown Through Veins of Spine.

Washington—(AP)—Violent coughing and muscle straining may spread cancer and infections throughout the body, Dr. Oscar V. Batson of Philadelphia reported recently in The Annals of Surgery, official journal of the American College of Surgeons, the discovery that apparently localized cancers or abscesses may actually be thrown even to the brain—through the veins of the spine.

It is well known, he said, that cancer often spreads rapidly through the lymphatic glands to many parts of the body. However, some cancers have been known to spread mysteriously without involving the lymph glands.

In solving this riddle, the nearest approach to the adequate treatment of cancer, the Philadelphia physician injected a metallic solution into men and monkeys through an external pelvic vein and studied its progress upward through the veins of the spinal cord and into other parts of the body.

It was possible, he reported, to duplicate the spread of cancer and to follow its progress by continuous x-ray pictures on the By artificial compresses on the

body of a monkey, it was also found that the act of straining or coughing forces blood out of the body cavity and into the veins of the spine. Injections of the solution into the breast were found to travel quickly into the brain.

The studies also showed without question that lung cancer and lung abscesses are spread up and out of the internal parts of the body through the spinal veins.

### 'Bellyache' May Be Caused by Ulcers

New York—(AP)—Don't sniff at a child's complaint of "bellyache," parents and physicians were told recently.

In a report before The American Medical Association Dr. Clarence E. Bird of Providence, R. I. said ulcers of the stomach and duodenum are much more common than has been supposed and

must be suspected when abdominal pains occur. Among 215 cases of ulcerations of these two parts of the digestive system, 77 of them occurred in children during the first two years of life, 18 between the ages of two and six, 45 between 7 and 11 years of age, and 66 between the ages of 12 and 15.

Two of the warning symptoms he declared, are pain and refusal to eat.

### Girl's Temperature Goes As High as 112 Degrees

Cincinnati, O.—(AP)—A red-headed "volcano" girl who regularly bursts to a temperature of 112 degrees was described here recently before a meeting of the American Psychiatric Association. The temperature is believed to be the highest yet recorded in a human being and according to a revision medical belief she should actually burn up and die. How, according to Dr. Esther B. Hertz of the Longview State Hospital, Cincinnati, she is normally a healthy, happy girl bothered only by the regular attacks.

These attacks resemble the common conception of the rage of a volcano. The young girl becomes violent and uncooperative but a few hours later is calm and smiling. Her trouble, Dr. Hertz explained is epilepsy of the pituitary gland. The "master" gland of the body lying at the base of the brain which controls the activity of all other glands of the body.

Gland Goes Out of Control. This periodically the pituitary gland goes out of control and with sudden surges of hormone outpouring it causes the thyroid and para-thyroid, adrenals, pancreas and ovaries to stimulate the heart, lungs, nerves and muscles to super-vent activity. The heart races, the lungs pump violently, muscles twitch involuntarily, the brain is thrown out of control.

Heretofore it has been believed that a temperature of 104 was dangerous, 106 was hopeless, and 107 was sure death. One man in a demonstration at the American Medical Association meeting last year, however, pushed the figure to 108. At the same meeting Dr. Temple Fay of Philadelphia showed that it was possible to reduce

### Venus Sunsets Records Made

Four Young Scientists Return with 1,500 Photographs.

Pasadena, Calif.—(AP)—Four young scientists have returned from a mountain-top camp with 1,500 photographs of sunsets on the planet Venus.

They said probably not more than a dozen astronomers had observed the phenomenon during the last 100 years. They described the photographs as the first successful series of pictures of the sunset over Mars.

The pictorial record was started last year at Lowell observatory, Flagstaff, Ariz., by J. B. Edson, Edson and three other graduate students at the California Institute of Technology—J. L. Wright, Richard Cairnright and Ernest Wright—camped for two weeks on Lookout mountain, 90 miles southeast of here, taking daily pictures of the Smithsonian solar observatory.

Time for Phenomenon. The expedition, said Edson, was timed to coincide with the sunset phenomenon on Venus. Venus is visible only when Venus is almost, but not quite, directly between the earth and the sun.

Edson said they saw Venus as a thin silver crescent, the horns of which bent toward each other until the planet was visible as a delicate ring of light. Astronomers call this Venus as a gigantic "dust bowl." Changes in the dim "arms" of Venus twilight permitted calculations of the height to which the atmosphere extends above the planet's surface.

Berkeley, Calif.—(AP)—A test-tube calf, bred while its father was at the National Dairy Show here and its mother was at the New York World's Fair, was born recently in Glendale, Ariz.

Dr. Kenneth G. McKay, of the University of California Veterinary School said it was the first example of transcontinental artificial breeding and demonstrated the practicality of distributing the seed of outstanding sires among dams in widely scattered over the country.

### Says Columbus Good Sailor

#### Harvard Professor Sees Explorer Shrewd, Accurate Observer.

Cambridge, Mass.—(AP)—After retracing the routes followed by Christopher Columbus and studying his sea journals, Harvard's Prof. Samuel Morison announced recently his belief that the discoverer was a "master navigator and a shrewd and accurate observer with a keen sense of beauty."

Back from a month of sailing the Caribbean in a ketch, Morison said, he had definitely found Columbus' first new world harbor, on the island of San Salvador, as well as his second landing place, in northern Cuba.

Last summer, in beginning the Harvard Columbus expedition, Morison sailed the route followed by Columbus across the North Atlantic. Most previous researchers, he said, were in libraries, rather than at sea. He added that existing charts of Columbus' routes were 80 per cent inaccurate.

Landed on West Side. This summer's quest, the professor said, showed that the discoverer's first landing on San Salvador must have been on a beach on the seaward, or west, side of the island, known now as Hall's Landing. Reefs surrounding the island would have wrecked Columbus' vessel had he tried to gain shore except for a two-mile opening on this side, Morison explained.

Following the course of the explorer's first voyage as described in his very detailed journal, Morison sailed from San Salvador to the northern coast of Cuba, and came in halfway between Bahia Baray and Puerto Gibara, both of which, with many other Cuban ports, claim the honor of being Columbus' first Cuban port.

He found that Bahia Baray fitted well Columbus' description of his first Cuban port and that Puerto Gibara answered the description given by Columbus of his second port.

The purpose of the Harvard expedition, which last year carried Professor Morison some 10,000 miles to ten countries, was to make a definite estimate of Columbus as a seaman and a discoverer and to identify definitely the places he visited. The sea exploration of the expedition now is ended.

### Helicopter Is Driven by Air

#### Propeller Blade Hollow; Wind Stream Comes From Fan Inside.

Atlanta, Ga.—(AP)—A helicopter whose rotor or propeller blade is driven by air—much like a lawn sprinkler turned by water—is being developed by scientists at the Georgia School of Technology.

The blade, which lifts and maneuvers the experimental flying machine in any direction, is hollow and is driven at great speed by a jet of air from a nozzle at its tip. Other helicopters have a mechanically-driven rotor.

Six years of research under Prof. Montgomery Knight, head of the aeronautics school, have brought the machine to a point where it may take the air for its final tests this year.

The single-seater, 100-horsepower machine is about 16 feet long and eight feet high. It weighs 500 pounds.

Generated by Fan. The helicopter's wind stream is generated by a motor-driven fan 18 inches in diameter inside the fuselage. The fan has 28 two-inch blades and revolves at 12,000 revolutions a minute. The rotor—single-blade propeller with a counter-weight to balance it—serves as wing, propeller, elevator, aileron and rudder. The angle at which the rotor is tilted determines whether the machine travels up, down, forward, backward or in circles.

The machine Knight said, is somewhat like a rocket or old-fashioned fireworks pin wheel in that it employs what is known as "jet propulsion."
