Dies Probers Publish Report on Activities Of Nazis in America

Says Diplomats Interested in Spreading Work of Transocean News Service; Report Plan for Organization for German Industry in America After Present War Ends.

Washington, Nov. 21.—(AP)—The Dies Committee published today its long-heralded "white paper," reporting on its investigation of German activities in the United States. It set forth testimony and documentary evidence designed to show: 1. That German diplomats took a lively interest in spreading the work of the Transocean News Service (not affiliated with any American news service) which the committee described as a "propaganda agency capable of engaging in espionage activities."
