## Removal of Attaches Asked 25 Years Ago

No Hesitation on Withdrawal Whether the charges were true or not, Boy-Ed and Von Papen were in sufficiently bad repute that their usefulness as enways was over, and Germany did not hesitate about withdrawing them on Lonsing's request.

Von Papen sailed quietly for Europe Dec. 21, 1915, after a secret farewell dinner at the Ritz Carlton hotel in New York for which German Ambassador Von Bernstorff (also the subject of numerous charges) and Captain Boy-Ed came from Washington.

Boy-Ed sailed a week later, comewhat less quietly. There was a throng of newspapermen, policemen and civilians at the pier. In the melee, Boy-Ed was shoved around considerably, and with his hat knocked over one year, he distributed copies of a statement generally denying the accusations against him and blaming them on British influence on the American newspapers.

Boy-Ed was killed in a fall from horse in Germany in 1930. Von Papen after the war entered Von Papen after the war entered politics, where he has displayed remarkable power of survival. He was one of the rapid succession of chancellors under President Von Hindenburg during the hectic days of Hitler's rise, and only the falling president's intervention is believed to have saved him from the Nazi purge, later to gain Hitler's favor and become his "trouble-shooting" ambassador.

Hindenburg's last official signature was on the appointment of Von Papen as minister to Austria, the root of his present influential position in German diplomacy—a rather more successful phase than his essay at World war diplomacy in the United States.


