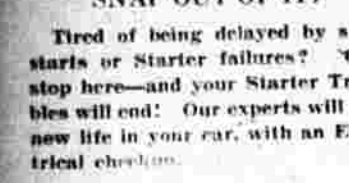

Demands Farm Parity Income

O'Neal Urges Congress To 'Gear Up' Present Program.

Baltimore, Md., Dec. 10.—(AP)—Edward A. O'Neal, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation, demanded today that Congress "gear up" the present farm parity program to meet the needs of the farmer.

O'Neal, in his address opening the federation's 22nd annual convention, declared that farmers have done everything asked them under AAA.

"They have adjusted their acreages," O'Neal asserted, "they have voted marketing quotas on themselves, they have taken their own money out of their pockets and have given it to the government to buy their products. They have produced more than the people can eat and wear—and still they have not received the price of their products."

O'Neal urged that the government should "gear up" the present farm parity program, acreage adjustment, and marketing quota program, to meet the needs of the farmer.

"The government should buy the surplus of farm products," O'Neal declared, "and should distribute it to the people at a price which will give the farmer a parity income."
