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Blind Boer War Veteran Giving Aid to Sightless

London, Dec. 11.—Along the walls of Long Meadow, beautiful estate of a blind veteran of the Boer war, a bustling, sometimes stumbling procession of men and women moves each day.

They are a new class of blind created by a new war using the new methods of bombing large cities from the air.

Britain's National Institute for the blind is training them to resume their places in society, places which they literally were "bombed out of."

Of 28 men and women at Long Meadow, as under the blind Thames, all earned their living before being blinded.

Some were married, had homes and a variety of interests.

As soon as they left the hospitals they came to Long Meadow and under the tutelage of its owner, 78-year-old Capt. Sir Bechcroft Towner, blinded himself by the Boer war, they began to learn again to walk, to eat and to dress.

Children sent to "Sunshine Home" Blinded children are sent to one of three "sunshine homes" to learn to live in darkness.

Almost brusque with outsiders, Sir Bechcroft is equally as gentle with the pupils he leads about the spacious estate which he threw open at the start of the war for the express purpose of rehabilitating the blind.

Patients he walks them about, casually tells them most of the furniture at Long Meadow. He has made at his carpenter bench, demonstrates his skill with gold chips on the table's edge.

Observed Epiphany Eve when this territory was first settled, the new calendar had not been universally accepted, and according to tradition, the people of this man-made island which forms a part of the chain protecting the state's southern coast, observed Epiphany eve on the anniversary of the birth of Christ.

At the little schoolhouse, which is lit every hour of the day and night with the low boom of the surf, the Christmas program will be given twice and there will be a big community tree. The tree will be sent over by mail boat because Rodanthe has only one real tree left—a gnarled old oak.

"Old Buck" is a whimsical representation of Rodanthe's second Christmas which seems more in keeping with Halloween. Here "Old Buck" is the "Old Buck" and the "Old Buck" is the "Old Buck".
