Washington, Dec. 18.—(AP)—President Roosevelt vetoed the Logan-Walter bill today, asserting he was convinced it would produce the utmost chaos and paralysis in the administration of the government at this critical time.

The bill, center of a congressional controversy, was designed by its sponsors to establish uniform procedure and expedite methods of review of administrative rulings of certain quasi-judicial federal agencies.

Work Begun on Selecting Chain of Air, Naval Bases

Washington, Dec. 18.—(AP)—Actual work has started, authorities here revealed today, on the selection and surveying of a chain of air and naval bases in South and Central America.

The inter-American bases, which will be made available to the air and naval forces of all 21 American republics, were described as outposts in the establishment of an impenetrable defense system to insure the western hemisphere against aggression from other European powers.

The defense plans will be provided by the United States and Central American republics, and will remain their property, without leases or any change in sovereignty.

The United States, by loans to the various nations, will finance the construction of the bases, including expansion of existing facilities for servicing and repairing ships and planes, and the fortification of the bases, these sources reported.

While most of the bases still are in the planning stage, their locations and other details have been selected for all but one. In each instance, the decision on the bases was reached by the military and naval authorities of the country involved, working in collaboration with United States officials.

with which to pay our aid, proceed very quickly to the making of such terms as they can with Hitler and Mussolini. Then the war management and all the rest, without the slightest chance of evasion, upon Congress.
There is, of course, just one alternative to such a refusal or failure of Congress to act in time to prevent the collapse of Britain, or other than such collapse or the wholly unlikely continuation. He the war to a successful conclusion without our help. That is the extreme recourse of the declaration of a prime national emergency, by President Roosevelt, and his assumption of the role of a wartime dictator. It is even conceivable that Morgenthau's position has been taken with deliberate intent.

Point in Garvin Case
The termination of the Garvin homicide case in plea of guilty to second degree murder by the two defendants, with the imposition of life sentences upon both, seems to us to draw its greatest significance from a remark made by State's Attorney Howard C. Bradford of Wethersfield County. He said that the plea of guilty was the result of the acceptance of the second degree plea.
The crime was one of peculiar interest to the people of this State. Garvin, 58 years old, was anxious to inherit a sizeable fortune from his father, George H., who was a prominent business man in the Garvin place, was despite the disapproval of his wife, a close associate of the man who had killed him. He had attended a trade school and knew something about electrical devices. The elder Garvin was in the habit of sitting in an automobile on the place at night to listen to the car's radio. Charles Garvin induced the boy to rig up an explosive charge under the seat of the car, with wiring and a firing device at its terminal a short distance away. On the last Labor day one of the pair manipulated the firing device.

Congress Responsibility
Secretary Morgenthau's declaration that Sir Frederick Phillips, undersecretary of the British Treasury, has made the statement that Britain can make no more commitments for war materials from the United States granted financial assistance should have a sobering effect on members of Congress who seem to have been making a kind of political game out of the world's plight. Morgenthau, in connection with this revelation, repeated his definite assertion that he would take no steps toward the granting of British loan unless Congress re-passed the Johnson Act. His attitude toward that piece of legislation is that while it technically prohibits only private corporations and individuals from making loans to nations in default on World War debts it would be a violation of its spirit and probable intent if the government to make such loans. Morgenthau thus puts the question of more aid to Britain squarely up to Congress.
There are enough isolationist senators to not only constitute a powerful opposition to a proposal to repeal the Johnson Act but probably enough to filibuster successfully against such a proposal, unless, for once, the majority of the members should muster up the energy to impose closure upon debate—which for many of them would be much worse than the amputation of all their limbs. And we do not believe that it is excluding the prohibitionists and isolationists are some who would like nothing better than to see Great Britain go down to defeat, and, leastly disregarding the consequences to ourselves and the kind of civilization we know.

Food for Munitions
While the agitation for the feeding of the people subsided in Germany, the same measure of temporary suspension in this country there is a general opinion that it will soon crop up again. Mr. Hoover has indicated that he is not willing to accept the refusal of the British government to loan the blockade as final. Statistics show that 400,000 people die of high blood pressure every year. It is not a disease, but rather a symptom of one or more different conditions which may exist in the body. It is not an abnormality, but rather the abnormal state of the body that produces this symptom. The high blood pressure is found in cases of neuritis, or inflammation of the kidney, hardening of the arteries, hypertension of the arteries and a general toxic state of the system. These are only part of the conditions which are responsible for increasing the blood pressure. At one time it was thought that the normal blood pressure of any individual could be estimated by the formula: 100 plus the age. For instance a man of 40 would be considered to be normal with a blood pressure of 140. However, this standard is now considered to be too high. A blood pressure of 140 is considered to be positive evidence of high blood pressure and an indication of some disease in the system.
