Blundering Nazi Threats

One of the most curious developments of the war is the psychological blundering of the Nazis in connection with the suggestion of British Shipping Minister R. H. Cross that enemy ships be allowed to pass through the British States ports pending the making of a decision by the British Government. No official notice had been taken of this suggestion by any American authority. It is the only spoken of in the press in the most detached way. There were no more obvious obstacles in the way of such a proceeding, and it was an open state of war to give the proposal any serious standing. It was, in fact, nothing more than a casual expression of longing by a single Briton.

Now the German press and the Nazi regime knew this as well as anybody. They were perfectly well aware that the United States Government had no notion of handing over to the British a fleet of ships belonging in very large part to Denmark. But instead of saying so the Nazi propagandists thought they saw a chance in the very minor episode to score a great point. They would impress the world with the power of their threats. So they persisted in believing that this country was on the point of setting the ships and delivering them to British hands— and proceeded to make the most bombastic threats against America should she dare to do this. The idea, of course, was that, when no such transfer was made, to create a lot of Nazi capital out of its inability to do this. The United States has been frightened out of its intention by a few sharp words barked by Hitler's spokesmen.

Which was a first class example of reckoning without the other fellow. While very few Americans would have favored even a nominal consideration of the Cross suggestion before the war had broken out, it is not in the least certain that such a proposal was formally made today. It would receive the support of a very considerable part of the American people, or even that it might not receive the cheers of an actual majority.

When they do become convinced that the Nazis are just that crazy the lid will blow off and those Hitlerite revolutionaries will be the most violent advocates of a smash-Hitler policy.

And the Nazi threats are not more than a perfunctory intention to bear rising from this desire country a great roar of sentiment that we see every potential enemy ship not only in the United States but in the Western Hemisphere and hand the whole lot over to the British, merely by way of showing the Nazis where they get off.

Apparently not even 1911-12 was enough to show the Germans how completely usable they are in understanding the psychology of America.

Improved Situation

The prospect of having Viscount Halifax in Washington as the representative of the British Government is not likely to arouse any special enthusiasm among the

American people. There is a very general and very definite belief in this country that Lord Halifax was, in a period which history shows to have been a desperately crucial one, a particularly unfortunate influence on British international policy and a principal promoter of a number of territorial conflicts into which the Chamberlain government was led. Halifax has been unduly feeble policy of Britain toward Hitler's constant pressure toward patriarchy during a period of years and for the later approach of the war. He has been at Munich; but it would be a decided overstatement to say that Halifax is a popular figure in this country.

Just the same it is to be taken into consideration that there is no factor in Lord Halifax's character that could work injury to either his own country or to the one through his service as ambassador in Washington. He is a man of fact his job here should be, on an easy one, almost automatic. This nation and its government are committed to all-out support of Britain in her conflict with the Axis. There is no missionary work to be performed. All that is to be done is to sit tight and avoid saying or doing anything to spill the beans.

Also, it is to be remembered that an ambassador in Washington, Lord Halifax will not only be removed from a position of much greater responsibility and that State ports might be opened to the British. No official notice had been taken of this suggestion by any American authority. It is the only spoken of in the press in the most detached way. There were no more obvious obstacles in the way of such a proceeding, and it was an open state of war to give the proposal any serious standing. It was, in fact, nothing more than a casual expression of longing by a single Briton.

Now the German press and the Nazi regime knew this as well as anybody. They were perfectly well aware that the United States Government had no notion of handing over to the British a fleet of ships belonging in very large part to Denmark. But instead of saying so the Nazi propagandists thought they saw a chance in the very minor episode to score a great point. They would impress the world with the power of their threats. So they persisted in believing that this country was on the point of setting the ships and delivering them to British hands— and proceeded to make the most bombastic threats against America should she dare to do this. The idea, of course, was that, when no such transfer was made, to create a lot of Nazi capital out of its inability to do this. The United States has been frightened out of its intention by a few sharp words barked by Hitler's spokesmen.

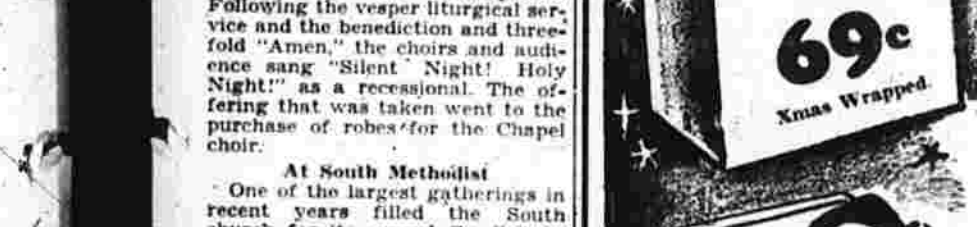
