Captain Bligh described Christian as an able seaman, of a remaster's mate at the time of the mutiny, had made two previous voyages with Bligh. Christian also led the flight to Pitcairn Island, taking eight other mutineers, six native men, 12 na-tive women and one child. But the romantic adventure ended soon after they reached their Pa-cific hideaway Although safe from British law, they were still Natives and whites clashed, first over one of the women, later because the sailors treated the natives as slaves.
