

1940: WAR IN REVIEW













Waves Pound West Coast

Houses and Shops Collapse; Many Families Flee from Area.

Los Angeles, Dec. 27.—(AP)—Giant waves, born on extremely high tides, continued to pound southern California coastal sections for miles today after collapsing numerous beach houses and commercial shops and causing many families to flee. Redondo Beach suffered much of the damage although further inland a large section of railroad Point Ferrous, a high "ambly bluff" that for years has been slowly slipping into the sea, carrying stretches of pavement with it. Some abandoned buildings were destroyed. At Redondo Beach, where a major disaster committee assembled and American Legion guards and all available police were called out to patrol the area, some homes and apartments completely collapsed while others fell in a lumbering mass part way through their undermined foundations.

May Seek Right To Tap 'Phones

Washington, Dec. 27.—(AP)—Congress may be asked to permit Federal agents to tap the telephone wires of suspected persons in cases involving espionage, sabotage, sedition and kidnaping. Senator Schwartz (D-Wyo.) and Gurney (R-Ind.) said today that such a recommendation was being studied by an Interstate Commerce Subcommittee, which has been investigating wire tapping for some months. They added that as yet there had been no agreement on limitations which most members thought should surround such activity. Schwartz said it had been suggested that the present law be changed to permit government agents to listen in on private telephone conversations after they had obtained the consent of a federal judge. This could be done, he explained, in confidential conference.

Ban Is Placed On Vital Goods

Britain to Restrict Re-Export of Commodities To Ireland Soon.

London, Dec. 27.—(AP)—Britain placed restrictions today upon the re-export to Ireland (Ireland) of several vital commodities brought across the Atlantic in ships guarded by British guns.
The Board of Trade, a government department, issued an order prohibiting exportation to Ireland without license of cattle feed, fertilizer, unmanufactured tobacco, oranges, lemons and several classes of tools—all items important to Irish economy.
Ireland is a big cattle exporter, but depends upon imports for feed and fertilizer. She normally imports about \$10,000,000 worth of corn annually, and about \$2,500,000 worth of fertilizer.
No other source of supply except Britain.
Under the new order, effective Jan. 1, the Board of Trade can refuse or stop the flow of these commodities to Ireland, which has no other source of supply except Britain.
Many Britishers declare that Ireland, because of her refusal to furnish bases for British convoys, should be deprived of the products the convoys bring from abroad.
Ireland has declared her neutrality in the European war and


