**Bombing of Elre**

Yesterday's bombing of a dozen towns and areas in the vicinity of Dublin brings the position of Elre in this war as an ally of Britain in no time at all.

One of the most distressing situations of the war has been the one created by the relationship of Elre in the conflict and to Great Britain. Elre is the only member of the British Commonwealth of Nations to maintain a neutral position.

But it just happens that this very geographical position which has made her a point of high strategic importance—and a major factor in the war—has also made her a target for German bombers.

Without the means to repel a German invasion if one should come, Elre is in constant danger of having her coast ports seized by the Nazis to be used as the ports of France are now being used, as bases for U-boats in a further intensification of the German counter-blockade of Britain.

Indeed it is not at all difficult to conceive of Elre being taken over, almost as easily as Norway was, and being used as a third jumping place for the German invasion of England itself.

The deep anxiety of the British government over the situation in Ireland is therefore in no need of explanation. So long as the Irish government persists in its determination to remain neutral, Elre must continue to be a source of acute danger—of very great danger—to Britain.

The German government has definitely refused to allow the British navy to use the Irish coast for the purpose of attacking them, and, in all probability, to bring the German bombers which are already making their abortive—and fatal—raids over Ireland by way of working. Yet, if the Germans should take over in Elre, or should attempt to do so, the whole country would immediately become a battleground, because it would be desperately necessary for the British to attack them there and drive them out—or lose the war.

The Irish are standing on exactly the same ground where the Dutch stood. They intend, they declare, to defend their neutrality. That is what the Dutch said, and what they valiantly tried to do, until the result that they lost their country, tens of thousands of them, and their lives and 36,000 buildings in Rotterdam were razed to the ground, leaving that great city an vast ruin.

As valiant fighters as the world knows, the Irish are not likely to provide them with opportunity for employment.
