Roosevelt Foretells 'Physical Attack' 'If Dictator Nations Win This War'

Unprecedented 'Peril' Now Faced by Nation; Urges Speedy Arming

Washington, Jan. 6.—(AP)—President Roosevelt today foretold a "physical attack" on the United States "if the dictators win this war" in a message to Congress urging a "swift and driving increase" in armament production. The United States, the chief executive told the legislators, faces an unprecedented "foreign peril." He asked that the war supplies turned out in the swift-paced program he envisioned be made available for the fighting "democracies" abroad as well as for this country's own defense forces.

"The need of the moment," Mr. Roosevelt said in his annual message on the state of the union, "is that our actions and our policy should be devoted primarily, not exclusively, to meeting this foreign peril. For all our domestic problems are now a part of the great emergency."

British Vanguard Already Nearing Base at Tobruk

More Than 30,000 Prisoners Captured When 'Suicide Garrison' at Bardia Surrenders to Combined Air, Land and Sea Assault.

Cairo, Egypt, Jan. 6.—(AP)—Britain's Army of the Nile, pushing swiftly into Libya beyond captured Bardia, reported today that its vanguards already were approaching Tobruk, Italy's next big seaport base 70 miles farther west. So far, a general headquarters communiqué said, the British have counted more than 30,000 prisoners taken when Bardia's "suicide garrison" surrendered yesterday to British land, sea and air assault.

Quantities of tanks, guns, equipment and stores of all sorts also fell to the British when their flag was raised over the Fascist outpost, making it the new advance base for their African drive, the communiqué said.

May Strike Quickly
While the right thrust into the Tobruk area does not necessarily mean an imminent new offensive, British sources said it would not be surprising if Gen. Sir Archibald P. Wavell decided to strike quickly again before the Italians can recover from the Bardia defeat.

Eleven Italian planes were shot down in yesterday's fighting without the loss of a single British plane. R.A.F. command said. Other Fascist aircraft were reported badly damaged.

Berlin Silence During Week Seen Ominous

Foreign Correspondents Reminded of Similar Periods Preceding Important Nazi Moves.

Berlin, Jan. 6.—(AP)—The week began in Berlin with a continuation of the ominous silence in authoritative quarters, already noticeable last week, which strikingly remained old timers among foreign correspondents of similar periods of silence such as that preceding the beginning of the air battle of London last August.

It also recalled the silence of late August, 1938, just before the outbreak of war, and in April and May, 1940, before the campaign in Scandinavia, the Low Countries and France.

All questions regarding troop movements in the Balkans were ruled out as referring to military secrets, hence discussion of them was taboo.

New Bodies Are Named By Churchill

Will Take Charge of Britain's Production, Imports and Post-War Reconstruction Policy.

London, Jan. 6.—(AP)—Prime Minister Churchill today named three new government executive bodies to take charge of Britain's production, imports and post-war reconstruction policy.

The assignments are: Production—Labor Minister Ernest Bevin; Imports—Minister of Supply Sir Andrew Duncan; Reconstruction Policy—Arthur Greenwood, minister without portfolio.

The prime minister named as members of Sir Andrew's Committee: Lord Beaverbrook, minister for aircraft production; A. V. Alexander, first lord of the Admiralty; Capt. Oliver Lyttelton, president of the Board of Trade.

Soviet Balkan Envoys Speeding to Moscow

Ministers to Bulgaria, Yugoslavia, Rumania, Hungary Called to Kremlin for Reports.

Bucharest, Jan. 6.—(AP)—Soviet Russia's ministers to Bulgaria, Yugoslavia, Rumania and Hungary sped to Moscow today reportedly for Kremlin consultations on German's ever-increasing military might in the Balkans.

The summing of the envoys was taken here as the first definite evidence the Russians have given of their interest in the large scale German troop movements of the last week.

Forty troop trains a day have moved across Hungary into Rumania, which was off entirely from communication with the outside world early today.

Charge d'Affaires Visits Foreign Office to Protest on Nazi Bombings.

Berlin, Jan. 6.—(AP)—William Warnock, Ireland's charge d'affaires, visited the Foreign Office today to present the government's views respecting alleged flights by German planes over Irish territory.

The Irish Department of External Affairs formally has blamed the Nazis for the bombing of three areas in neutral Ireland in the past week.

It announced last Friday that an "unofficial protest" to the German government against the violation of Irish territory by German aircraft and the loss of life and destruction of property was being made.

Rome, Jan. 6.—(AP)—The Italian high command reported today that "more strongholds on the Bardia front have fallen into British hands in Libya," but did not mention the fate of Bardia itself.

The British claimed capture of the eastern Libyan base yesterday and said more than 30,000 Italians and six generals were taken prisoner there.

Case Still Mystery

War Danger Chief Point In Message

Roosevelt Sees American Security Seriously Threatened; Urges Increase in Arms.

Washington, Jan. 6.—(AP)—Some sentences from President Roosevelt's annual message to Congress:

I address you at a moment unprecedented in the history of the union. I use the word "unprecedented" because at no previous time has American security been so seriously threatened from without as it is today.

No realistic American can interpret from a dictator's peace overtures the intention, or return of true independence, or world disarmament, or freedom of expression.
