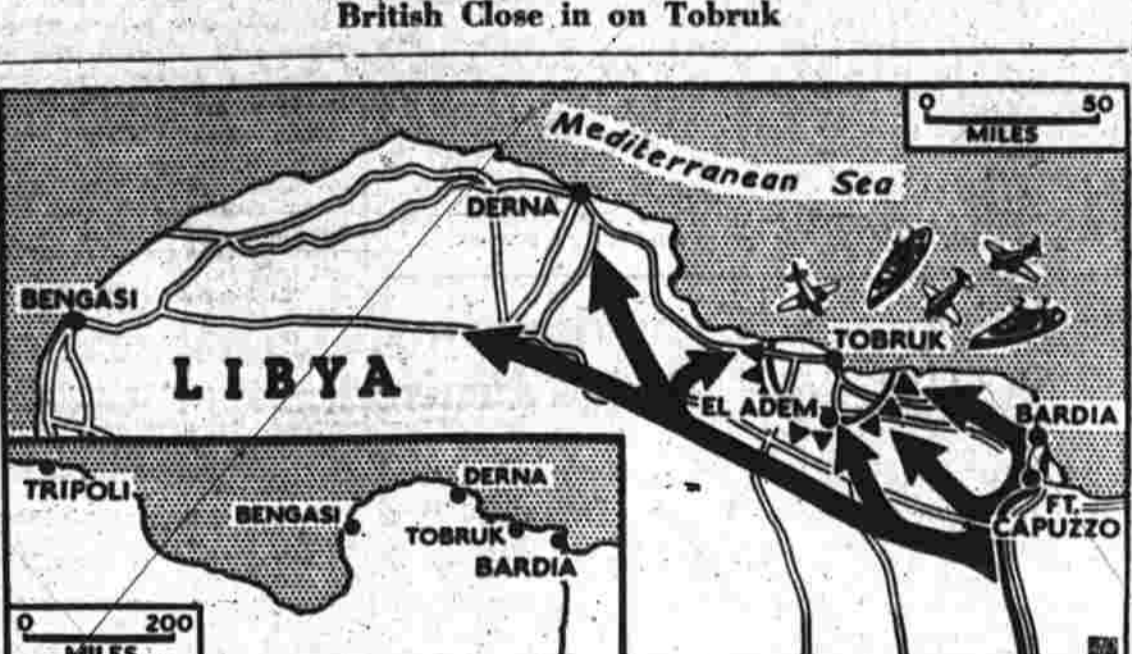

Plans to File More Counts

New Charges Against Zazzaro Expected to Be Delivered Today

Hartford, Jan. 8.—(AP)—Additional counts alleging violation of the 30-day credit limit of the state liquor law today were to be filed against Anthony P. Zazzaro, local politician and businessman, and his wife, Mrs. Zazzaro, who were indicted today at the state's attorney's office.

It is expected that the new charges, numbering 13 in all, bringing the total number of charges to 22 against Zazzaro, will be delivered to his counsel this afternoon.

Charges Credit Extended Zazzaro was arrested Oct. 31 on nine counts charging that he directed or induced the extension of credit for more than 30 days to holders or backers of holders of liquor permits. The state liquor law prohibits extension of credit for more than 30 days by a brewer to a retailer. Zazzaro is cited in the indictment as a stockholder of The Dover Brewing Company, Hartford.

Zazzaro, who has been at liberty under bond, is scheduled to appear in court at 10 a. m. today for the opening of Superior Court. Zazzaro will be put on trial on that day if the state's attorney is ready to file the charges.

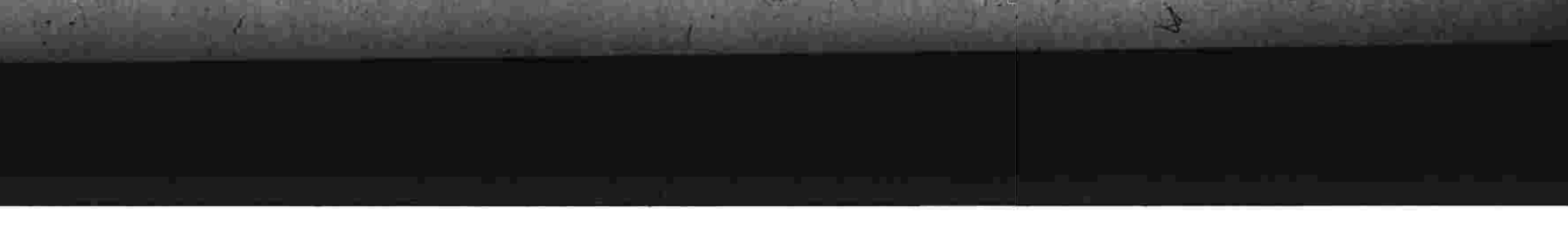
