

Churchill And The Socialists On Peace

In addressing the Senate 24 years ago this month (three months before the U.S. entered the World War), President Wilson called for a "peace without victory" in Europe. Then as now there was much talk of a negotiated peace. Below are his statements with those President Roosevelt made before Congress this week.

"Victory would hean peace forced upon the loser, a victor's terms imposed upon the van-quished. Only a peace between equals can last. The guarantees exchanged must neither recognize nor imply a difference between big nations and small. "There can be no stability . there is not tranquility of spirit and a sense of justice, of freedom, and of right."






