Senator Wheeler declares that the lead-lease program of aid to Britain and her allies means "open and complete war." He says he does not follow the reaction of either the German government spokesmen or the Nazi press. If President Roosevelt's proposals constitute a challenge to Germany as Wheeler states, that Germany has either snuffed the Germans or else they have not intended to accept the lead-lease program. He says they have been repeating with a fine show of dignity that Germany does not intend to allow American aid to "prevail" in any American attitude of unfriendliness.
