State Capitol, Hartford, Jan. 15.—(P)—Gov. Robert A. Hurley sent his first batch of appointments to the General Assembly today, reappointing Judges Earnest C. Simpson and John A. Cornell of the Superior Court and Associate Judge Abraham S. Borden of the Hartford County Common Pleas court. The appointments, which must be confirmed by both branches, came as the General Assembly returned to work after a week's recess.

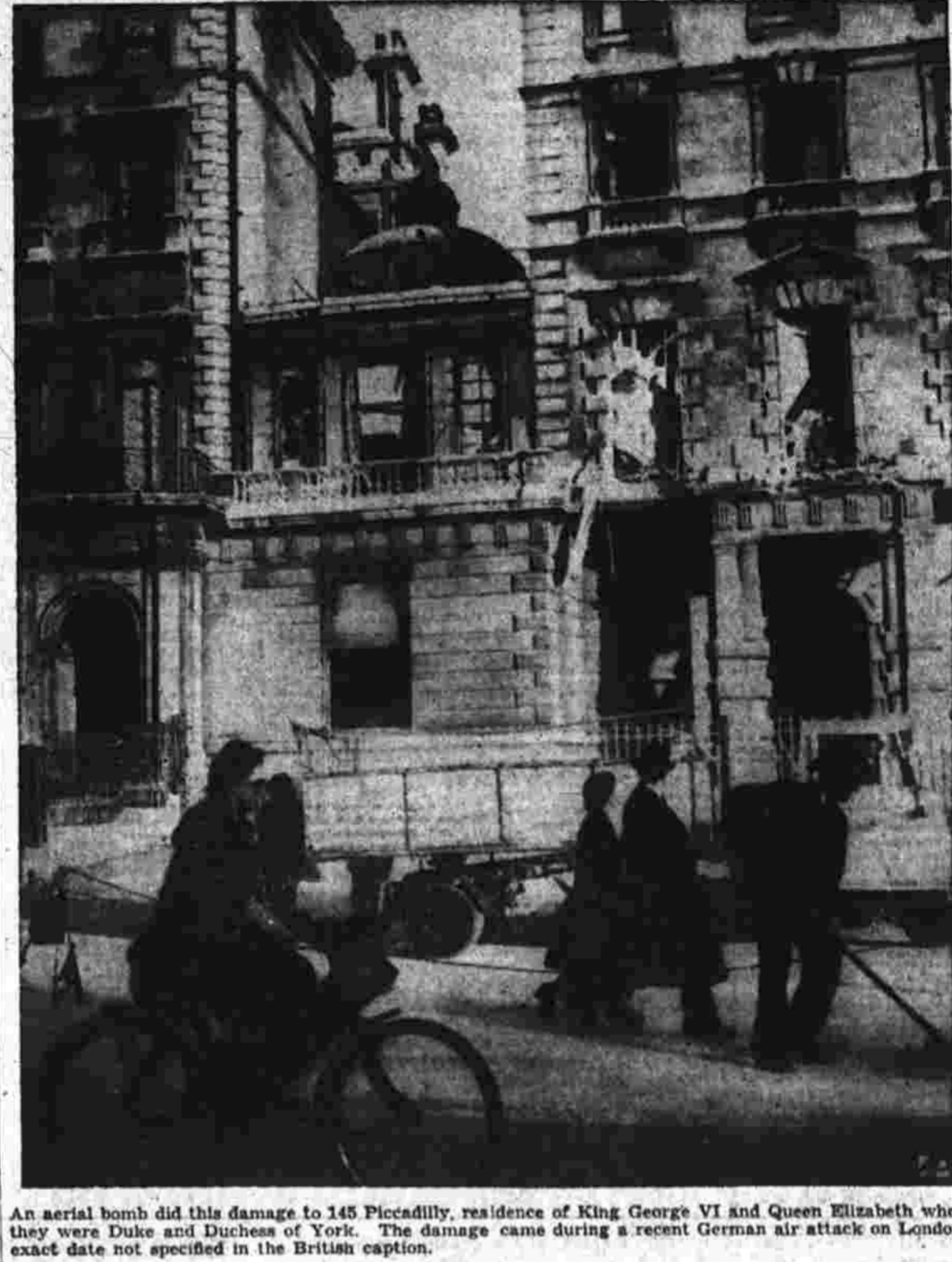

## Hull Urges Enactment Of Aid-to-Britain Bill; Navy Seeks 400 Ships

Would Build Small Vessels, Including Sub Chasers, Mine Sweepers, Torpedo Boats; Also Requests Extra Facilities for Construction; 280 'Urgently Needed,' Chief Says.

Washington, Jan. 15.—(P)—The Navy asked Congress today for authority to build 400 small vessels, including sub chasers, mine sweepers and torpedo boats, and asked also for extra facilities to construct them. Rear Admiral Samuel M. Robinson, chief of the Bureau of Ships, informed the House Naval Affairs Committee that 280 of the vessels were "urgently needed" and that Congress would be asked immediately for \$310,460,000 for their construction and armament and \$25,000,000 for expansion of building facilities.

The bulk of the small craft which will be completed in the fiscal year 1942 will be constructed on the Great Lakes.

The 280 vessels including 26 165-foot seagoing sub chasers for an escort vessel; 20 110-foot wooden sub chasers; 20 torpedo boats; 18 185-foot mine sweepers, 22 faster mine sweepers, 90 motor mine sweepers and 50 coastal mine sweepers.

Endeavors to Acquire Request. Earlier in his session, the committee unanimously endorsed the Navy's request for a \$300,000,000 strengthening of the fleet's anti-aircraft power.

Rear Admiral W. R. Furlong, chief of ordnance, told the committee a major part of the program would involve the installation aboard larger ships of a new type of 5-inch anti-aircraft gun which he said was "the best we've ever seen." He said it was effective 31,000 feet in the air and had a much greater horizontal range.

In addition to the new guns, the committee was told, the program provides for "splinter protection" for gun crews and other deck personnel.

Rear Admiral Samuel M. Robinson, chief of the Bureau of Ships, testified that protection included the installation of thin plates of high tensile steel around the anti-aircraft guns. These plates, he said, would be opened at the top so as to allow the guns to be aimed in any direction.

In all, the committee is considering requests for authority to purchase 400 small vessels, including 26 165-foot seagoing sub chasers for an escort vessel; 20 110-foot wooden sub chasers; 20 torpedo boats; 18 185-foot mine sweepers, 22 faster mine sweepers, 90 motor mine sweepers and 50 coastal mine sweepers.

## Greek Forces Resume Drive Toward Berat

Throw Back Two Italian Counter-Attacks; Fascists Making Desperate Stand Now.

Athens, Jan. 15.—(P)—Greek forces resumed their advance toward Berat in central Albania after throwing back two Italian counter-attacks described by a spokesman as constituting a "defensive on a very restricted scale." Twice the Italians hurled infantry against the Greeks. Greek accounts said, and after being repelled, fell back through heavy snowdrifts and severe cold to naturally strong positions. These snowdrifts were said to have occurred north of Klisura, recently captured by the Greeks.

"They acknowledged the Fascist forces were making a desperate effort to hold their new lines," Army Action News.

Bad weather curtailed operations somewhat along the entire Albanian front, but Greek sources reported intense local engagements. Artillery action was noted on both the Klisura sector and the coastal area, where the Greeks claimed Italian positions had been undergoing heavy pounding.

The Greek command said unfavorable weather had prevented air activity.

## Parley Called To Seek Way To Halt Row

Michigan Governor Invites Federal Conciliator, Union and Eaton Heads to Conference.

Lansing, Mich., Jan. 15.—(P)—Gov. Murray D. Van Wagener called a conference in his executive office this afternoon to seek settlement of CIO union strikes in five plants of the Eaton Manufacturing Co., which is making airplane parts on national defense subcontract.

James F. Dewey, Federal Labor Conciliator who has been attempting a settlement in conference at Detroit, R. J. Thomas, president of the United Automobile Workers (CIO), and a spokesman for the Eaton Company's Wilcox-Hughes Division at Saginaw, Mich., will participate in the conference.

Can Return To Jobs. Van Wagener said he had received the assurance of Irving Carey, president of the UAW-APL, which holds an exclusive bargaining contract at the Saginaw plant, that some 250 CIO members who were involved in a strike last November could be returned to their jobs a few at a time. The governor added he was informed that more than 25 of them returned to work this morning.

No specific hour was set for this morning's meeting.

## Snow Reduces Aerial Activity

Two British Villages Attacked by Germans; Bombs Drop in Bog.

London, Jan. 15.—(P)—Snowy weather restricted German air activity over Britain today, but a few planes came over nevertheless and at least two villages were attacked.

Observers on the coast saw two German bombers boom in the storm over Dover Strait and soon there was a report that one had dropped 16 bombs at a southeast village. There were no casualties.

The German high command reported today Luftwaffe activities over Britain were limited to scouting flights because of "unfavorable weather."

"In this action," the high command said, "the good effect of raids on war-essential objectives and at Plymouth and Portsmouth carried out on recent nights has been observed."

Little to Report. The British reported no air activity over England last night.

## Secretary of State First Witness on Historic Legislation; Believes Passage Is 'Absolutely Necessary' to Nation's Defense; Asserts Nazis Easily Could Cross Atlantic If Victorious.

Washington, Jan. 15.—(P)—Summoning the nation to "invoke the law of self-defense before it is too late," Secretary of State Hull urged upon Congress today the enactment of legislation for unlimited supplies of war materials to Britain and other nations battling a "world movement of conquest." Hull testified before the House Foreign Affairs Committee in support of President Roosevelt's lend-lease bill. He was the first witness on this historic legislation and he expressed the belief it was "absolutely necessary" to the nation's defense.

In a statement of about 3,500 words he also said that if the Atlantic ocean fell "into German hands" it would "offer little or no assurance of security."

"Were Britain defeated and were she to lose command of the seas," he said "Germany could easily cross the Atlantic. Especially by the North Atlantic. Unless we were ready and able to do what Britain is doing now."

Secretary of State Hull also took occasion to voice some of the strongest condemnation of the expansionist policies of the Japanese in the Far East which had been uttered by the administration.

Among other things, he said Japan's new order would lead, economically, to "impoverishment" of invaded parts of the Orient and, socially, to "destruction of personal liberties and the reduction of the conquered peoples to the level of inferiors."

Pointedly he asserted that Germany, Japan and Italy had made unmistakably clear their "intentions to repudiate and destroy the very foundations of a civilized world order under law" and to conquer and establish "tyrannical rules over their victims."

When Hull finished the statement, committee members turned to questioning him and Rep. Zachary W. Chandler (D-Tex.) asked whether a section of the president's lend-lease bill providing for repair of belligerent vessels, such as those of Britain, in United States ports, violated international law.

## Investigating Bomber Fleet

London, Jan. 15.—(P)—The British minister of economic warfare, Hugh Dalton, was said authoritatively today to be investigating reports that Soviet Russia proposes to form a 100-vessel merchant fleet to carry produce from the Americas to Russia. This reported intention of Moscow was seen here as of great significance to Britain's attempt to strangle Germany by the blockade, since it would mean that Russia's trade obligations with the West could be fully met from her own resources, unless Russian themselves are to go short.
