London, Jan. 15.—(P)—The British announced tonight that last Friday's attack by German dive bombers and Italian planes on a Mediterranean convoy was so effective that British Naval forces were forced to sink their own badly damaged 9,100-ton cruiser Southampton.

Fire broke out aboard the smashed warship while she was being towed to port, said a communiqué, the crew abandoned ship.
