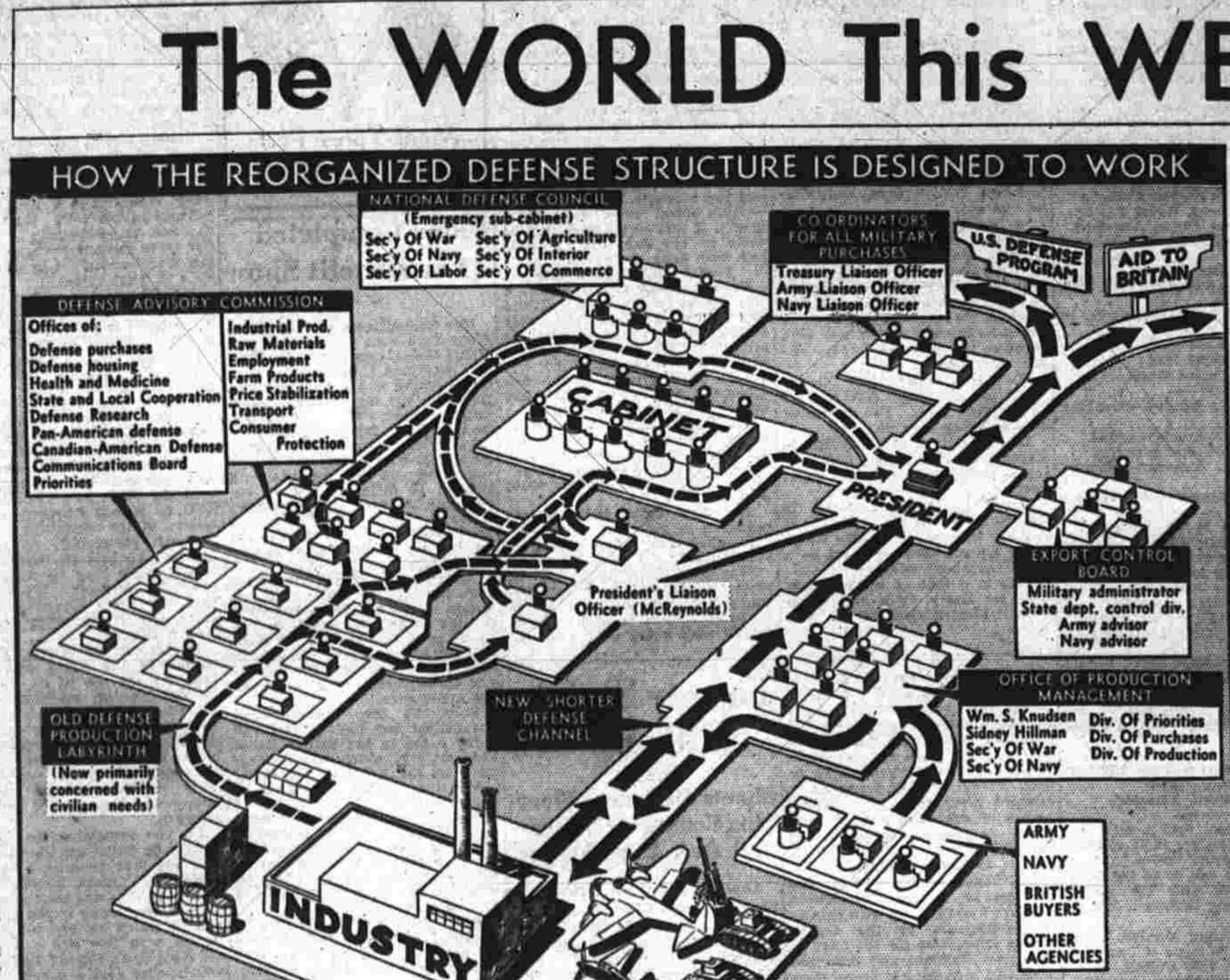

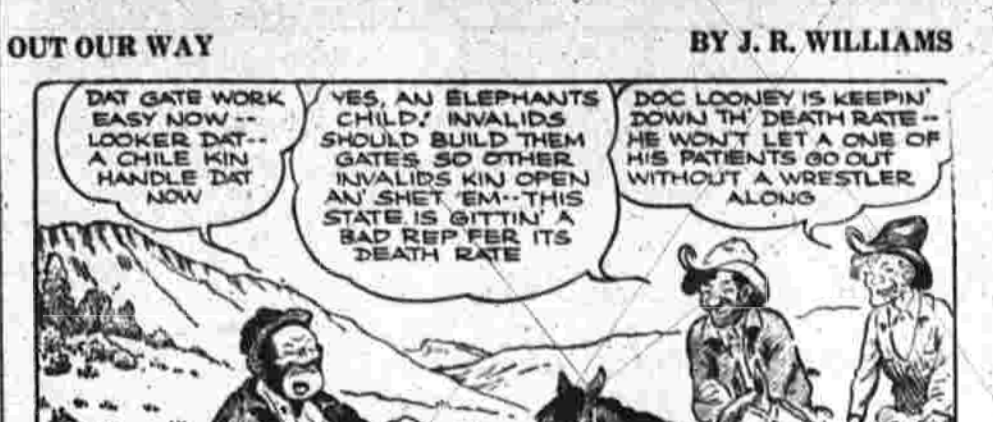

Pastor Speaks At Club Here

Rev. Truman Woodward Makes Address Before Organization.

Rev. Truman Woodward, pastor of the East Hartford Center Congregational church, was the guest speaker of the Cosmopolitan Club of Manchester yesterday afternoon. He spoke on the topic "As Our World Grows Smaller," developing the thought, through illustrations of factual conditions, with which we are all familiar today.

World Has Shrank He carried the theme further into the realm of an inspirational message, emphasizing the law of reaction and reaction in social relationships and personal conduct. He brought out as a significant point that as the world has shrank so small it becomes obvious that anything we do or experience has a like reaction on somebody else.

When we suffer we know others suffer, when we are blessed, we know others are blessed without blessing or hurting our neighbors. I always say if you cast motley bread upon the waters it will come back to you, but if you cast good, whole some bread, it will come back good and wholesome to you.

Practical Toleration Mr. Woodward also said, "The least we can do is to be tolerant of one another, tolerant of different races, tolerant of different religions. We must respect the rights of others. We say that the doctrine of 'Live and let Live' is an important doctrine in America, but we also take for granted that to this doctrine should be added 'Speak and let Speak,' 'Think and let Think,' 'Write and let Write,' 'Worship and let Worship.'

Help Your Neighbor Carrying on, Mr. Woodward suggested that in this day of a contracting world, not only a large degree of tolerance is necessary, but that to this should be added real magnanimity. We should practice and not into practice such doctrines as "Live and Help Live," "Speak and Help Speak," "Think and Help Think," "Worship and Help Worship." "We must do something for our neighbors,—that is the real democracy, the real Christianity."

In conclusion he stressed the point that as people try to follow the principle of these doctrines of magnanimity they can do no better than to try to shed some light of the Master along the way. Just as the twelve disciples did, so that the world may grow better as it grows smaller.

Tax Payments Kept Up Well

Collector Nelson Reports 97 Per Cent Has Been Already Paid.

Current taxes due the town are nearly 97 per cent collected. Tax collector Samuel Nelson, Jr., reports. The total amount to be collected was \$8,000,397.40. Of this \$863,027.40 has been collected leaving only \$7,137,370 to be paid. During the present month \$4,142.15 was paid. From this, Collector Nelson feels, there will be other good payments made between now and the time when it will be necessary to send out notices of intention to file liens, which will be April 1.

Spurred Record The amount of uncollected taxes has been greatly reduced during the past four years. According to the figures of the tax collector, there was due the town for unpaid back taxes, \$235,000 as of Aug. 1, 1936. All of this has been collected with the exception of \$30,000. This means that in addition to the collection of the current taxes each year also collected was \$205,000 in back taxes. In addition interest also had to be paid. Last year the collector turned over to the Town Treasurer over \$12,000 collected for interest charges, which brought the net cost of operating the office to less than the expense.

Personal Taxes Payments to date on old age assistance tax, which is not due until February 1, were made by 1,273 persons. Of these over 600 have made payments so far this month.

New Lighting Draws Praise

Main Street Illumination Is Claimed Great Safety Factor.

The new 1000 candle power lights on Main street from the center to Hartford road have been in operation a week today, giving to most people of Manchester an opportunity to see what a big improvement there has been in the lighting of the street. In addition to the favorable impression made upon visitors.

There are now burning 54 of these lights which replace 54 of the old lights that furnished 100 candle power. It cost the town \$42 each for the old lights while the new lights are costing \$70 each. This means that for the new lights the town is paying \$3,780 a year against the former charge of \$2,274, or an increase of \$1,506 a year while the amount of light

that is now being furnished is two and one half times as much with increased cost of less than one third.

It is possible to see persons crossing the street for a distance of over 500 yards with the new lights and is sure to reduce the number of accidents, those who have checked the situation claim.

Mile of Pipe Added to Line

Town Now Operates Section Purchased from Cheney Brothers.

During the year the town purchased from Cheney Brothers one mile of 16-inch water main that is already laid in Hartford road from a point opposite the Rogers Paper company for a distance of about 500 feet west of Bridge street. The town paid for this pipe \$5,000. This is far less than the pipe could be bought for at the market price. In addition to buying the pipe there is also the cost that would have had to be figured in laying it and making the necessary connections, which would be about three times as much as was paid for the pipe alone. This is a pipe that will supply water to the section that is fast growing in the western part of the town and also will improve the water pressure in other developments.

The charge for the pipe to the South Manchester Fire District is not to be made at 16 cents a foot, as would be the charge in other parts of the town, but for eight cents a foot. This does not mean that the supply of water in the pipe is only half. A 16 inch pipe will supply four times as much water as an eight inch pipe, although some may not think this is possible.

This is a pipe line that Cheney Brothers used at one time to draw water from Cheney's pond in the west part of the town, used in connection with manufacturing. This is no longer needed by the company and the town's water department needs the pipe line to take care of the increased demands for water.
