

Fleeing Italians Driven from Sudan As Kassala Falls

British Forces Are Aided by Ethiopians in New Drive; Fascists Said to Be in Flight On 200 Mile Front; Ethiopians Big Factor.

Cairo, Egypt, Jan. 20.—(AP)—British forces, in pursuit of Italians falling back from the Anglo-Egyptian Sudan, have pushed into Eritrea, at two points, British headquarters announced today.

Localties about Bahderat and Tessenet, which the Italians have strongly fortified, were yesterday occupied without opposition by our troops, the bulletin said.

In Colton Growing Region (If the British have taken Tessenet and have pushed beyond it to the east, they apparently are driving down the valley of the River Gash which flows in the direction of the Red Sea at the western port of Massawa, which an R.A.F. communique said was twice raided Saturday night.)

The Italian troops along this front are retreating, pursued and harassed by our mobile detachments, it added.

Kassala, only 15 miles from the border of Italian Eritrea, had been in Italian hands since last July and was the last Anglo-Egyptian Sudan city held by Fascist forces.

They were said to have abandoned the city on Saturday night almost without firing a shot.

In the Mediterranean, German dive-bombers struck twice at the harbor area of Valletta, Malta, during the weekend and the British said "at least" 15 raiders were shot down in Sunday's heavy rain.

Enlisted Men Under Watch For Insanity

Two Involved in Tearing Of Nazi Flag at Liberty from Psychopathic Ward of Hospital.

Washington, Jan. 20.—(AP)—The Navy said today its two enlisted men involved in the tearing of a Nazi flag at San Francisco lately had been "under observation in the psychopathic ward" of the Naval hospital on Mare Island, Calif.

They were at Liberty from the hospital, it was said at the time of the incident.

Renewed although unofficial German demands for satisfaction today raised the question of whether the State Department would go beyond its written expression of regret over the destruction of the German consulate's swastika flag in San Francisco.

Regress Follow Protest The State Department expressed its regrets over the incident yesterday in response to a protest from the German embassy. Hours later authorized sources in Berlin announced that the German Charge D'Affaires here had been instructed to ask punishment of the two men arrested in the case, as well as assurances that the consulate would be permitted to fly the flag.

There was some speculation that the authorities would be made aware of the note the State Department had sent. This note was not an apology because, diplomats here explained, governments are not permitted to formally for acts which they attribute to individuals.

The State Department informed the embassy disposition of the case would be made by San Francisco authorities.

Roosevelt Proclaims Purpose to Protect American Democracy

Highest Court Annuls State Alien Statute Rules Out Penn. Law On Registration; G. M. Loses Finance Appeal; New River Rule Stands

Washington, Jan. 20.—(AP)—The Supreme Court held today that the passage of the 1940 federal law requiring registration of aliens invalidated a 1939 Pennsylvania alien registration statute. Justice Black delivered the opinion, which upheld Justice Department contentions that the regulation of alien registration is exclusively the concern of the federal government.

Justice Stone wrote a dissenting opinion in which Chief Justice Hughes and Justice McReynolds concurred. Justice Black said that the power to restrict, limit, regulate and register aliens as a distinct group is not an equal and continuous existing concurrent power of state and nation, but whatever power a state may have is subordinate to supreme national law.

Point of Dissent Justice Stone, in his dissenting opinion, asserted: "Assuming, as the court holds, that Congress could constitutionally set up an exclusive registration system for aliens, I think it has not done so and that it is not the province of the courts to do that which Congress has failed to do." Justice Stone added that "at a time when the exercise of the federal power is being rapidly expanded through Congressional action, it is difficult to overstate the importance of safeguarding against such encroachments of state power by vague inferences as to what Congress might have intended if it had considered the matter or by reference to our own conceptions of a policy which Congress has not expressed and which cannot be inferred from the legislation which it has enacted."

Greeks Intensify Attacks North of Klisura; Pound Italian Positions With Artillery. Athens, Jan. 20.—(AP)—A destructive raid with fire and high explosive bombs on Berati, Italian-held town in the oil region of central Albania, was reported today by the R. A. F. middle east command.

Bombs fell on military concentrations and motor transport, and buildings east of the town were hit, several fires being started, war bulletin said.

Despite steady bad weather, the Greeks intensified attacks north of Klisura, and pounded Italian positions heavily with artillery, dispatches from the front said. Greek planes also were reported attacking and machine-gunning Italian troops.

Rome, Jan. 20.—(AP)—Virgilio Gayda, chief of the editor's staff of the Italian newspaper "Il Giornale D'Italia," said today that Germany and Italy were combining forces in the Mediterranean in an attempt to defeat the British there, at present the main theater of war.

Claim French Vessels Sunk

Siamese Report Victory In Naval Battle; Airplane Is Shot Down. Bangkok, Thailand, Jan. 20.—(AP)—Three French warships were sunk, the 7,800-ton French cruiser Lamotte-Picquet was believed sunk and a French Naval plane was shot down Friday in a Naval battle on the island of Koh Chang in the Gulf of Siam, the Siamese high command reported today.

Seven French warships led by the Lamotte-Picquet launched the attack early Friday, the communique said, but Thai Naval and Air Forces took up the challenge in a three-hour exchange of shells and air bombs.

The Lamotte-Picquet, it said, disappeared in a zig-zag retreat after the Thai cruiser Dhruvart scored several hits and five broke out in the engineer room. Thai reconnaissance planes were said later to have found no trace of the French warship.

The Dhruvart is a fast, new Italian-built cruiser of 4,200 tons mounting a 150-mm gun.

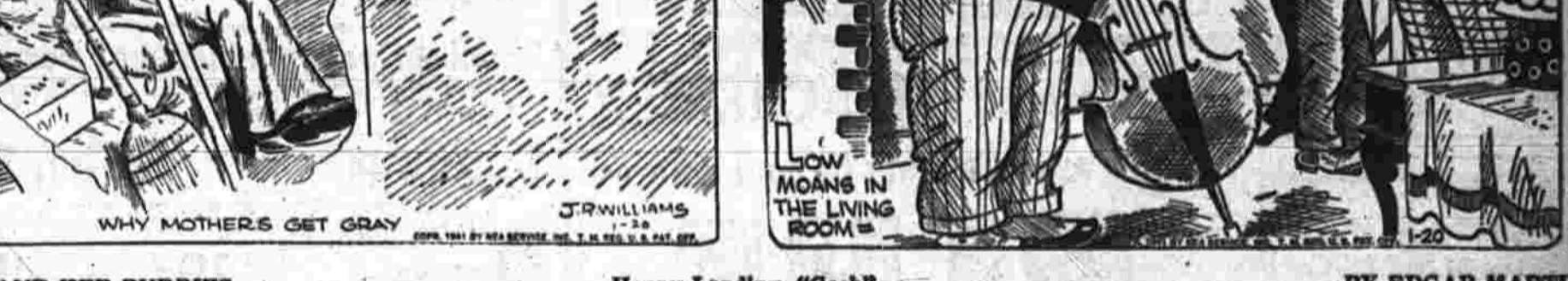
