Combines are used almost exclusively in winter wheat areas and are rapidly moving into spring wheat districts. Three men do the work of 10, in less time. The tractor was almost unknown in 1915; today there are approximately 1,600,000 in use.

The passing of the threshing machine robs farming of much of the co-operative spirit that marked agriculture's growth in the U.S. "bread basicet." Neighbors worked without pay to bring grain from fields to machine, knowing they would be similarly repaid. Only the owner of the putfit and his mechanics were paid in cash.
