

Resing Toil Not Inevitable.

It emphasized, however, that a rising toil of deaths and injuries could not be accepted as an inevitable accompaniment of national preparedness, stating that successful accident prevention of the face of increased exposure.

Conservation of national manpower, especially in the defense industries, must be a major objective of the national asfety program this year, the council decired. It reported that in 1940 accidental deaths among men in the Selective Service age bracket from 21 to 35 totaled approximately 16,000—equal to the destruction of a full Army division.



Off Newfoundland To Hold Concert

New York, Jan. 31.—(P)—A radio reports from a British freighter indicates big ocean-going Axis submarines may be operating east of St. John's, Newfoundland, site of one of the Naval bases leased by the U. S. from Britain.

The 4.868-ton Sheaf Crown reported last night she had sighted a "suspicious submarine" approximately 60 miles east of St. John's. No further word from her was heard.

Canada has no submarines, and it was believed unlikely that any U. S. underseas craft would be operating that far north.

In the past year, there have been several reports of Nami submarine activity in the Caribbean and off the coast of South America, but this was the first hint of operations at the northern end of the Great Banks, outside the Pan-American nautrality belt.



Therefore provision has been made for suthorizing "cost of living" bonuses where the re has been an increase of at least 5 per cent in the price level.



Who must file a return? Every single person having a gross income of \$800 or more; every married person, npt living with husband or wife, and having a gross income of \$800 or more; and married persons living with husband or wife, who have an aggregate gross income of \$2,000 or more.

When must returns be filed? For the calendar year, on er before March 15, 1941. For the fiscal year, on or before the 15th day of the third month following the close of the fiscal year.

Where and with whom must income tax returns be filed? In the internal revenue district in which the person lives or has his chief place of husiness, and with the collector of internal revenue.

How does one make out his income tax return? By following the detailed instructions given on Forms 1040.—A and 1040, the income tax blanks.

What is the tax rate? A normal tax of 4 per cent on the amount of the net income, arrived at by deducting legal exemptions and credits from the gross income; a surtax on the surtax net income in excess of \$4,000; and a defense tax of 10 per cent of the combined normal tax and surtax.
