To Aid Or Not To Aid?

SECRETARY OF THE TREASURY MORGENTHAU told Senators on the Foreign Relations Committee about a phone conversation he had with Bill Knudsen, director of the Office of Production Management.

"Knudsen called me up," he related, "and asked if something couldn't be done to permit the British to get 2,000 planes which they want but for which they haven't been able to place orders."

"Plant capacity was available for the orders, but the British could not get for lack of dollar exchange, Knudsen had explained.

"This said Morgenthau, showed why it was urgent that speedy action be taken on the British bill.

"FDR 'Very Receptive' President Roosevelt was called by Knudsen and Knudsen, who had been called by the British, indicated his anxiety to have the bill passed promptly.

"FDR conceded he could 'do anything under the sun under this bill,' one conference reported, 'but he was not prepared to make any concessions which would be tantamount to a surrender of the principle of self-determination.'

"The House Foreign Affairs Committee adopted the bill as provided and wrote into the bill a provision that would bar FDR from disposing of any war materials abroad without the consent of the Army and Navy chiefs.

"For the proposal to forbid the use of naval vessels to convey supplies to Britain, the committee hedged by providing that if neither authorization nor permits such use of vessels.

Chairman Bloom explained that if it rested in the hands of the President such power, that power will not be affected by this bill.

"The fact that the Senate Foreign Relations Committee Secretary Hull, fighting the filibuster in secret, members revealed that he had said U. S. assistance was largely responsible for the fact that Nazis have not invaded England.

Secretary Morgenthau told the committee that Britain's credit position in China "can continue to fight" unless the bill is enacted.

"The bill is being answered by warning that the power of Congress to pass a formal declaration of war has become a 'dead letter' since the bill passed.

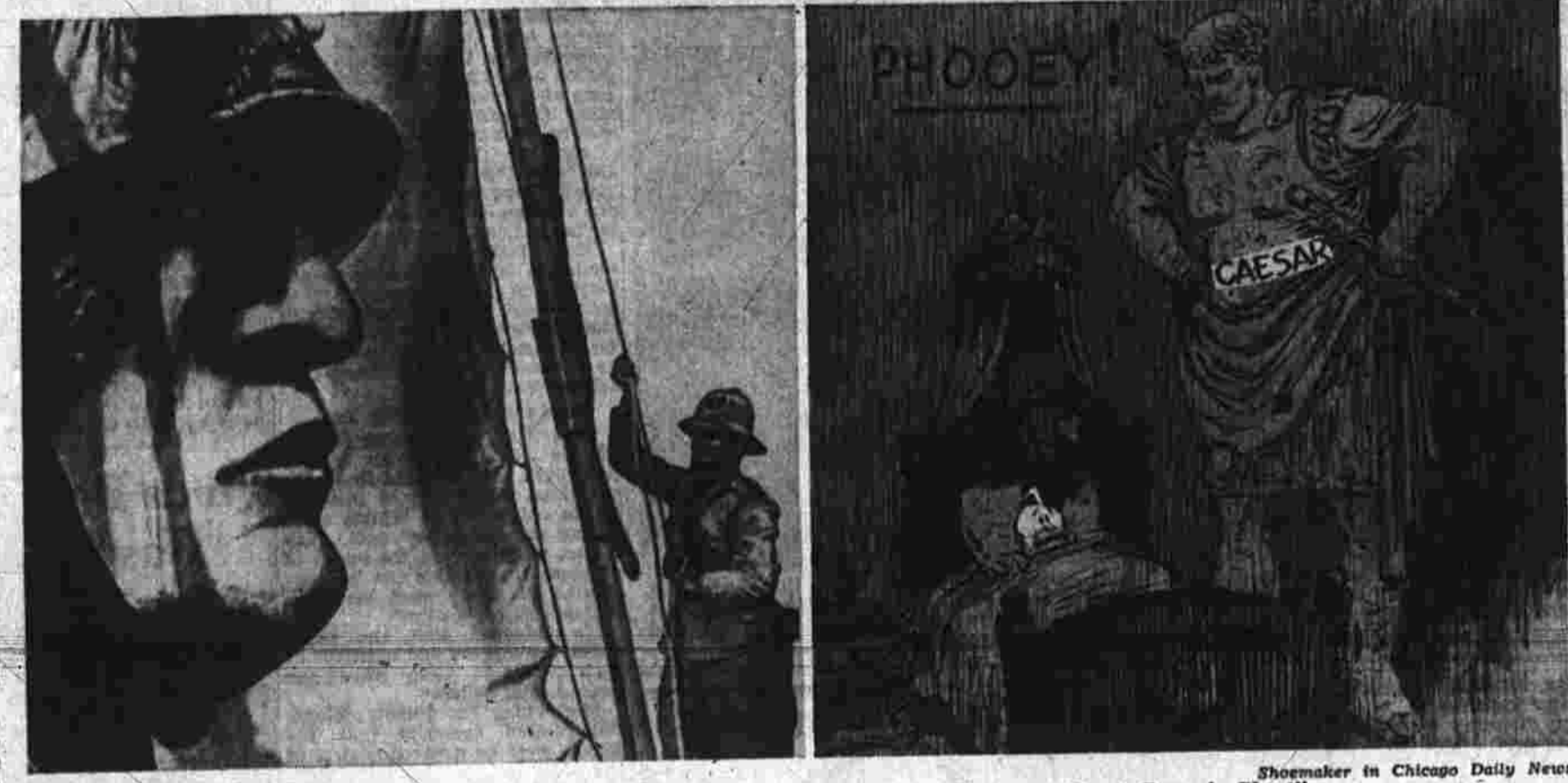

The Army and Navy chiefs were heard to say that the British Chief of Staff Marshall appeared, he told reporters he thought the aid contemplated under the bill.

MODERN Italy still lacks 20 years of being a united old. Before becoming a united nation in 1861, Italy was an agglomeration of backward, scattered principalities.

After unification, Italy became ambitious. But internal troubles near her status as a nation kept her confined to her peninsula until the turn of the century.

France and Germany had grabbed most of the colonial prizes. Italy made her belated debut as a nation in 1911, when she grabbed the territory of the area now known as Libya.

The area was under Turkey's steady rule. In 1911, an Italo-Turkish war developed from which Italy emerged not only with Libya but with the 14 strategic Dodecanese islands of Turkey.

Britain's Mounting Losses At Sea

REICHSMARSHAL HERMANN GOERING calculates that Great Britain needs the arrival and departure of more than 200 merchant ships a day to keep up her economy.

This week German U-boat forces in the North Atlantic are reported to have sunk a rate which inevitably must be paid for by the British.

Two Britons left out strong hints that Nazis were hitting hard enough to start shipping in the North Atlantic. Cross admitted that "we are in serious danger" as the result of the attack.

All told, at least 4,700,000 tons representing 1,250 ships of all flags has gone down. British losses have averaged 62,000 tons a week. She still is believed to have 20-25,000 tons in vessels available, because of ships she acquired from Norway.
