In the opening statement for the defense yesterday William E. The defense attorney said he intended to bring two special advisers into District court to help him conduct the case. One is H. Winship Wheatley, former president of the District of Columbia Bar Association. The other has not been named.





The Channel Islands, now strategically important in the threatened German invasion of Britain, are the home of Jersey and Guernsey cattle.

Cattle were one of the first animals domesticated by primitive man. The European breeds are descendants either from a native wild strain or from a domesticated Asian stock, brought in during the Aryan migration. Today there are more than 300 distinct breeds of cattle in the world.




