\$3 Pay Checks For Firemen

Each Year North End Firemen Get Money to Pay Old Age Tax.

John M. Miller, treasurer of the Eighth School and Utilities District, is signing \$3 checks today for each of the 60 members of the Manchester fire department.

The checks are drawn at this time so that the members may turn them over to the tax collector as old age assistance tax. Until the old age assistance tax was put in force, firemen were exempt from paying the \$2 poll tax, but under the old age assistance tax there is no exemption for firemen. The district committee voted to pay each member \$3 a year. It could not, it was found, pay the tax direct. As a result each year at this time the treasurer is given a list of names of the active members by Chief Grinnold and checks are drawn. It is not ordered that the money be used in paying the old age assistance tax, and the members of the department have always used it for this purpose.

Directors Meeting A year ago tomorrow William Foulds, Jr., was named president of the district. He has called the directors together each month and statements furnished of the standing of the district at each meeting and bills acted upon. At the annual meeting of the district last June a three mill tax was laid. Collector Joseph Chartier reports collections are good and the district has been able to meet its expenses. 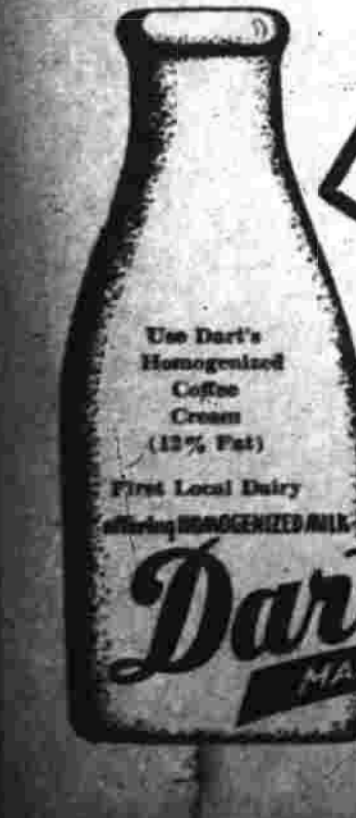
