



The Italian freighter Cape Noli was captured in the St. Lawrence by a Canadian ship, and the German freighter Weser became a Canadian prize off the Mexican coast.

While trying to build up its own strength, the Navy also has centributed officers and men to the British Navy. About 1,000 Canadians are serving on various British warships in various parts of the war zone.

Recruits offer themselves to the banadian Navy faster than new loss can be built or, otherwise lained; skilled workers for cernit types of service, however, are not so plentiful, and an intensive campaign to enlist such men is in progress.
