## Senate Committee Approves Aid Bill; Fear Lightning Thrust by Japanese

### Assembly Orders Committee Probe Of Civil Service

Investigation of 'Administration and Operation' of System to Determine Whether 'Simplification and Improvement' Is Required

State Capitol, Hartford, Feb. 13.—(AP)—The General Assembly ordered a legislative investigation today of the "administration and operation" of the Civil Service System to determine whether it required "simplification and improvement."

The House adopted and sent to the Senate a resolution for a legislative investigation of the "administration and operation" of the state's four-year-old merit system.

The measure was adopted by a voice vote, only a few scattering noes being audible.

Leaders Join in Support  
Republican and Democratic leaders joined in supporting the measure, introduced by Majority Leader William L. Hadden.

The measure, dropping as a bombshell without any previous warning, came less than 24 hours after the Civil Service System has been debated for more than four hours before the Judiciary Committee.

The measure would create a commission comprising two Senators and two representatives with power to subpoena witnesses. The body would be required to report to the Legislature on or before May 1 its findings together with a report on measures for "simplification and improvement" of the system, which affects some 13,000 state employees.

Investigation "Not Political"  
Rep. William L. Hadden, House Republican leader who introduced the resolution, asserted that the proposed investigation was "not political" and did not "smell of partisanship in any way."

He said the proposal had been discussed with Governor Hurley and Democratic leaders in the Senate and House and seemed to be of the opinion that the investigation was "not political."
