Japan As Peacemaker

WHILE the pint-sized war be-tween Thailand and French Indo-China continued to flare up despite a Japanese - engineered truce, agents of the two countries were in Tokyo.

As mediator of the peace confer-As mediator of the peace conterence, Japan insisted she was only interested in achieving a just peace and that she was not angling for concessions to expand her influence further into southeast Asia.

Tokyo's newspaper Asahi wrote:

"We expect both Thailand and In-

do-China to understand fully (our) impartiality and that Thailand will exercise self-restraint and not advance impossible terms, while Indo-China will have the wisdom of sac-

rificing relatively small interests in favor of the greater good."
