New Naval Radio School To Turn Out First Class

Moreton Heights, Feb. 18.—(AP)—The new naval radio school here, near the old Naval Academy, will graduate its first class in the air and under water, on March 1, the end of four months' training.

On March 1, the school's first class will depart for stations which may be as near as the Brooklyn Navy Yard, as remote, as the Sardinia islands.

Employed in Naval Radio, the men will be trained in the use of radio, radio mechanics, coding and decoding, naval procedure, typewriting, radio theory, direction finding and even codes for submarine detection.

Before enlisting, some of the boys were radio hams, but when they leave they will be qualified to take commercial jobs in the merchant marine, or in ship-to-shore stations.

Clients Called In Boltz Case

More Than 100 Subpoenaed to Explain Dealings: Guilty Plea.

Philadelphia, Feb. 18.—(AP)—The state called additional witnesses in the Boltz case today to bolster its charges that the 54-year-old financial consultant defrauded investors of millions of dollars in the 13-year operation of his investment firm.

They were among more than 100 of the Philadelphia lawyer's clients subpoenaed to explain their dealings with Boltz who pleaded guilty to state indictments charging fraudulent conversion and embezzlement of \$850,000 and violation of the Pennsylvania securities act.

Twenty-five one-time Boltz customers testified at the opening of the hearing yesterday to determine the amount to be imposed upon Boltz who faces possible maximum prison sentences of 500 years under the state true bills.

Hitler Target Of Messages

One of First Asks for Broadcast of Fuehrer's Funeral.

New York, Feb. 18.—(AP)—Adolf Hitler himself is the target of a message being broadcast by anti-Nazi Americans at the German government's expense.

R. C. A. Communications, Inc., said today hundreds of messages of varying indelicacies are being sent collect to the German radio, which provoked the blasts last Friday by requesting American comment on its program.

And despite the fact that one of the first messages asked for a broadcast of Hitler's funeral, and others followed by similar vein, CBS picked up by radio-wave last night an appeal for more opinions.

Directs Drive to Stifle Axis Economy and to Strangle Foes by Blockade, Bombs, Buying.

The job is much bigger than the Ministry of Blockade, which is the only comparable office in the last war cabinet, since it takes in the whole field of closing the areas of the world to Axis commerce, fighting in world markets for essential supplies and directing bombing squadrons to hit the dictators' internal economy will be hurt worst.

Expert in Three Subjects Dalton at 54 is a big, energetic, expert in law, economics and foreign affairs. Educated as a lawyer and economist, he lectured in the London school of economics, was parliamentary undersecretary for Very Fine (Heavy Bags) No. 1 Potatoes.

"Blockade alone will never win the war, but in conjunction with the armed forces it undoubtedly will shorten the war by a year," Dalton said.

A cautious speaker with an eloquent voice, Dalton is the British editor of the Baldwin and Chamberlain governments of the Ministry of Economic Warfare until Prime Minister Churchill called him to the post.

Before he entered the national government, Dalton called Chamberlain and Lord Roper "our greatest liabilities" and asserted that British people were concerned "at our failure to wage economic war as though we meant it."

"Legal prudence is delaying victory," he said because "the blockade is hamstrung by antiquated conceptions of the prize law."

When he took office, Dalton said: "My job is to strangle Hitler's economic life and do what I can to aid the fighting men. The law today must be made to fit the war and to meet our requirements."

"The war must be won by mobilizing all our national resources regardless of Tory traditions and vested interests."

He opposed conscription and toured the country campaigning for a capital tax on all persons possessing £10,000 or more.

"No more five figure incomes either in peace or war," he demanded.

Dalton has been regarded as a traitor to his class by Tories since he said in 1931 that he hoped the House of Lords would be abolished. His path to Socialistic prominence began in the shadow of Windsor Castle. His father was canon of St. George's at Windsor and tutor of King George V. Dalton went to Eton and Cambridge, where his conversion to Socialism began.

Joined in Parliament by "White" he entered Parliament in 1924 where he later was joined by his wife—becoming the third couple ever to sit in Commons.

Ambitious, austere, sometimes moose, but more often affable and genial, he is considered Labor's best foreign affairs expert and leading intellectual.

He is six feet tall with a shining bald pate above blue eyes. He speaks in a powerful, rich, smooth voice, the sound of which he obviously enjoys. Sometimes he closes his eyes and repeats a sentence he likes, for emphasis, and at other times he crashes his fist on the table with a bang.

4 Suffocate During Blaze

Three Women and Boy Victims in San Francisco Fire.

San Francisco, Feb. 18.—(AP)—Three women and an 8-year-old boy suffocated to death as fire destroyed the Mission Community center yesterday but scores of boys and girls counted themselves fortunate to have escaped unharmed, or with minor injuries.
