General Assembly Committee Rooms Main Activity Base

Calendar Stripped of Major Bills with Pass- age of Bitterly Con- tested Bridgeport Bond Issue; Memorial On Lease-Lend Bill.

State Capitol, Hartford, Feb. 26.—(P)—Its calendar stripped of major bills with the passage of the bitterly contested Bridgeport bond bill, the General Assembly shifted its main base of activity today to committee rooms for public hearings on scores of measures. Included among the proposals set for public debate was one memorializing Congress to pass the lease-lend bill and another calling for the ratification by Connecticut of the child labor amendment to the Federal constitution, an issue that has been hotly debated in several legislative sessions.

Another labor measure before the committee as they sought to speed up the flow of business into the two chambers was one creating a State Labor Relations Board affecting workers in interstate concerns which are not covered by the Federal Labor Relations law.

Gov. Robert A. Hurley said at his press conference that he had asked that Senator Alfred M. Bingham (D.) take charge of the hearing tomorrow on the administration bill because of the latter's knowledge of the subject.

Reterring that the milk problem should be considered without regard to politics, the chief executive said:

"I'd like to be accepted or rejected by those most interested—the farmers themselves."

In contrast to the confusion and drawn-out session of yesterday that closed late in the afternoon with the passage of the Bridgeport bill, both branches sped through quiet routine sessions before turning the legislative stage to the committee.

The House cleaned up its business in nine minutes and with its session enlivened by a bit of horseplay arising from the controversy over the granting of the bonding bonds to Socialist Mayor Jasper Melville of Bridgeport.

A mysterious box found its way to the clerk's desk and when Speaker Hugh M. Alcorn opened it he found a hammer, and an accompanying note which read:

"Presented to the General Assembly to meet its most pressing needs."

Parley Enters
Delicate Stage

Japanese Plan Based on Cession of 3 Tracts Of Land to Thailand.

Tokyo, Feb. 26.—(P)—The Tokyo peace conference in which Japan is mediating in Thailand's conflict with French Indo-China, "has entered into the most delicate stage" since the Japanese government ten days ago submitted "what is regarded as its final mediation" to the newspaper Asahi said.

The plan, according to outlines appearing in the press, calls for the cession of three considerable tracts along the Mekong river by Indo-China to Thailand. The tracts, the land was taken from her by the French between 1905 and 1907.

Defense Funds Are Approved By Committee

Immediate Outlay of \$1,533,439,702 in Cash, Contract Author- izations Is Favored.

Washington, Feb. 26.—(P)—An immediate outlay of \$1,533,439,702 in cash and contract authorizations for the Army and Navy was recommended by the House Appropriations Committee today. The sum included funds to develop Naval aviation outposts in the Pacific islands of Guam and Samoa.

In addition to money for a vast expansion of its shore bases, the House Naval Committee reported today that it had approved a construction of 40 submarine chasers and other small craft and to make possible the delivery by the end of the fiscal year of 1942 of 100 destroyers which had been planned originally.

Measures sent to President Roosevelt for his signature included one item recommended by the Budget Bureau—funds for a civilian police force for the Navy—and sent the measure immediately to the House floor for debate.

The bulk of the Army fund of \$268,118,000 was earmarked for construction, both new and under way. A total of \$338,000,000 was included to complete 184 cantonments and other housing projects in the direction of Cuba and Cape Verde.

The committee emphasized that despite delays and cost increases, the Army was entitled to commendation for the sincere, determined effort to do the best possible job of a construction job under the worst possible conditions both as to expedition and cost.

Bombers Head Toward Coast To Hit France

Apparently Following Up Heavy Night Attack On Ruhr Industrial Area, Occupied Zone.

London, Feb. 26.—(P)—A strong force of British bombers, guarded by waves of fighters, swept across the southeast-English coast in the direction of France this afternoon, apparently following up a heavy night attack on the Ruhr industrial area and airbases in Nazi-occupied France.

The bombers, which were escorted by fighters, were seen in the direction of Calais and Cape Gris Nez.

Then observers on the coast saw another formation streaking toward Dunkerque, while a third group moved in the direction of Boulogne.

No Announcement of Results
The British foreign secretary, Lord Halifax, completed his mission. There was no immediate announcement of results pending reports from pilots and observers.

Last night's attack was summed up in an Air Ministry communique which said:

"The British forces reconnoitered the Dover area, having completed its mission. There was no immediate announcement of results pending reports from pilots and observers."

"Last night, considerable numbers of aircraft of the same formation attacked industrial targets in the Ruhr and airbases in occupied France."

"The aircraft were also seen in the direction of Calais and Cape Gris Nez. One aircraft of the bomber command is missing."

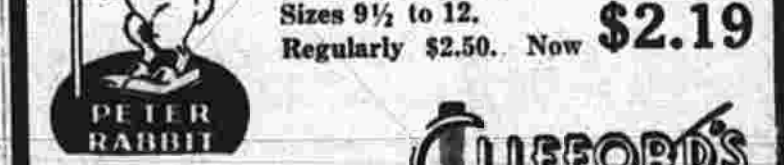
