

Should it be found possible to make a greater-than-planned use of existing machinery, that would amount to a partial victory for Walter Reuther, CIO official. Months ago he advanced a plan whereby he said planes could be produced at the rate of 500 a day in six months by using a greater portion of the auto industry's capacity. Some production experts are convinced that this rate can never be attained, but the government has been alow to write off the Reuther pl. n as all wrong.
