Figures For Estimates such estimates are based: According to calculations of the National Industrial Conference Board, the United States entered 1941 with about 7,000,000 workers still unemployed. The 1940 census indicates that this figure may be a bit high, but it is the lowest of most generally quoted estimates of unemployment and economists mostly regard it as a good middleof-the-road figure.

Also available during 1941 will be about 500,000 new workers added to the labor force. This is the excess of new young workers over the retirement of older ones and

500,000.

Requirements during 1941 are estimated about as follows:

1. For the Army, 1,100,000 men.

2. For agriculture during coming spring months about 1,000,000 men. This is the normal seasonal during the first six months about If the Army takes more than all of its men by July 1 as expected, this means unemployment will be reduced to less than 4,000,-000 by mid-summer. With a government emergency work force of WPA, CCC, and NYA of more

wpa, ccc, and NYA of more than 2,000,000, residual unemploy-ment would be down to less than 2,000,000 which is normal or even subnormal for an economy of the size of the United States. Bottlenecks May Interfere Industry may not be able to ex-Industry may not be able to expand fast enough to take on 2,000,000 new workers during the
first half of this year. Bottlenecks
of machinery and raw materials
may interfere. At the present moment, however, careful estimates
of prospective needs indicate that
this gain will be realized.

If it hits the expected pace, by
next fall the defensive drive will

next fall the defensive drive will be drawing workers from government projects and the farm. New tank, chemical and aircraft plants opening up next summer will increase the pressure for labor.

However, experts point out, there is a large surplus of farm workers which should prevent a runaway labor market from developing immediately. The Bureau of Agricultural Economics estimated that in 1940 there were about 3,500,000 workers on farm who could be spared without disturbing normal farm production.
