## Resentment Rises Against Municipal Audit Law Today

### Issue Raised as House Ready to Act on Senate Bill Eliminating Town Auditors; Harwinton Republican Protests Rapid Action.

State Capitol, Hartford, March 13.—(P)—Resentment against the uniform municipal audit law, passed two years ago as an aftermath of the Waterbury and other municipal fraud scandals, flared up today in the Connecticut House of Representatives. The issue was raised when the House was ready to act on a Senate bill eliminating town auditors, held unnecessary by the Finance Committee as a result of the municipal audit law which requires towns to have their accounts audited annually by independent accountants.

Rep. Chauncey E. Hutchins, old guard Republican from Harwinton, pointed out that measures repealing or modifying the municipal audit law awaited action in the Assembly, and protested that the town auditors should not be eliminated until it was determined whether the law would stand.

Housing Projects Here Call for Defense Funds

Manchester's total participation in the new program of WPA aid in defense housing projects under FHA supervision may reach the half-million dollar mark this year.

Estimated Expenditures. On the Terrace tract, it is planned to spend \$35,928 for six new roads, \$65,510 for 13,745 feet of sewer pipe and \$45,592 for 14,700 feet of water mains.

First Application. Last week a highway and sewer installation project was written for the Greenway Park tract, and at that time it was forecast that other developers would apply for government fund aid.
