Vichy, France, March 13.—(P)—
The government extended today to May 13 the time allowed Algerian native Jews to appeal for exemption from a law of last Oct. 8 depriving them of the right to vote.

The law originally provided that all claims for exemption—allowed war veterans in special cases—should be filed before Dec. 22.




