The bill, H. R. 11,320, would give the House Judiciary Committee authority to issue deportation orders against those who are found to be deportable.

Kramer, a member of the Immigration Committee, said his bill would embody all of Jackson's suggestions.

The tax proposal, along with numerous others, will receive the attention of the House Ways and Means Committee soon when it opens its broad study of the nation's entire tax structure.
