Waterbury Bonds Increase Rapped By Jury Member

Baldwin Criticizes Reduction in Tax Rate at Same Time City Seeks To Borrow More; Refers to Fuss Made in Bridgeport Refunding.

State Capitol, Hartford, March 18.—(AP)—Senator Clarence F. Baldwin (R), member of the Waterbury special grand jury, criticized the city today for reducing its tax rate at the same time that it sought legislative authority to increase its bonded indebtedness. He voiced his criticism as the Senate approved a bill authorizing Waterbury, which has a Democratic administration, to issue \$2,000,000 in bonds for a new water pipe line.

Baldwin, a member of the Finance Committee, said he did not oppose the bill, but he did object to the simultaneous reduction of Waterbury's tax rate from 32.5 to 31 mills and increase of its bonded indebtedness.

Same Issue in Bridgeport
Baldwin contended that the same issue was involved when Bridgeport recently sought authority to refund bonds while it proposed at the same time to reduce its tax rate. Without mentioning Socialist Mayor Jasper McLeary by name, Baldwin recalled that another mayor then had been called a "political fakir."

Waterbury's two Democratic senators, Michael Blainfield and Edward F. Egan, defended the fiscal policies of Mayor Vincent Scully of Waterbury. They contended that the Waterbury and Bridgeport situations were not comparable because, they said, their city sought the refunding of its old indebtedness.

Construction of the pipe line had been urged before the Finance Committee as a defense measure, witnesses saying that Waterbury at present had only one pipe line and that its industries might be hampered should anything happen to that line.

British Bombers Sink 'Enemy' Supply Vessel

Attack Wilhelmshaven, Bremen, Rotterdam, Oldenburg; Start Fires at Both Naval Bases.

London, March 18.—(AP)—Royal Air Force bombers last night sank a large "enemy" supply ship off the Frisian Islands in addition to attacking Wilhelmshaven, Bremen, Rotterdam and Oldenburg, the Air Ministry announced tonight.

Numerous explosions and fires were observed in dock and industrial areas of the German ports of Wilhelmshaven and Bremen, both naval bases, the communique said.

The large enemy supply vessel was said to have been sent down in a torpedo attack by an airplane of the coastal command. The communique said all the British planes returned from their overnight raiding assignments and the government announced that in air operations over England today two fighters, having spent their ammunition, were shot down by German planes and two German bombers were shot down.

The British pilots were said to have been unharmed. An early afternoon air raid was also reported.

The fines were levied against the firms because they had employed workers for more than 40 hours a week.

Japs' Envoy To See Reds At Moscow

Matsuoka to Pause on His Trip to Berlin for Parleys Which May Affect Role in Axis' Plans

Tokyo, March 18.—(AP)—Foreign Minister Yosuke Matsuoka, en route to Berlin and Rome, will pause in Moscow two days, it was announced today, for talks which observers believe would vitally affect Japan's role in Axis plans for a new world order.

Attaching the highest significance to the announcement, these sources expressed the opinion that Japan is seeking guarantees from Soviet Russia to safeguard her interests bordering Siberia before committing herself to any concrete action in partnership with Germany and Italy.

It was also understood the foreign minister would pause in Moscow on his return from Rome and Berlin, and observers said his discussions in the west would be made conditional upon what occurred in Moscow during both of his stop-overs there.

Neutral circles suggested cementing of relations with the Soviet was no less important from the Japanese point of view than the solution of the conflict with China which now is taking so much of Japan's energy and resources.

Anti German Mediation
Japanese newspapers have hinted that Germany might be asked to take a hand in mediating the war in China, and some quarters inclined to believe Matsuoka also might seek Berlin's aid in ironing out the Russian problem.

Matsuoka was expected by these quarters to take the attitude that Japan is willing to cooperate in a united spring push against Britain, provided China and Russia are eliminated from the picture—otherwise Japan is not in a position to act.

This view appeared partially borne out by an article in the Japanese press.

British Defeat Italians Again; 800 Captured

Repulse Counter-Attacks On Positions in Eritrea with Heavy Losses To Forces of Fascists.

Cairo, Egypt, March 18.—(AP)—Italian counter-attacks against British positions recently captured by the British in Eritrea have been repulsed with heavy Fascist losses, British general headquarters declared today.

The British said the Italians left over 800 prisoners in their hands. (This presumably, was at Cheren, mountain stronghold held by the British army toward Asmara, the capital of Eritrea, and Massawa, its chief port. The British command said yesterday that important heights outside Cheren had been taken.)

The Rome war bulletin also reported Italian counter attacks and said that the British had captured 800 prisoners.

Five Vessels Prey of Sub

Another Merchant Ship Sunk by Planes Scouting Over North Sea.

Berlin, March 18.—(AP)—A German submarine has sunk five armed merchantmen totaling 35,300 tons, out of a British convoy, the German high command reported today.

Another merchantman, of 4,000 tons, was sunk during armed German air reconnaissance over the North Sea east of Newcastle, the daily war bulletin added.

Port Facilities Bombed
In Newcastle itself, it said, port and dock facilities were bombed last night, and other air attacks were directed against ports on the Scottish east coast.

Four barrage balloons were said to have been shot down over Dover.

Churchill Says Nazi Cruisers Also Sent To American Coast

Declares British Ships Sunk on American Side by Warships as Well as U-Boats; Announces Certain Destruction of Three German Submarines; Destroyers from U. S. Coming into Action Now.

London, March 18.—(AP)—Prime Minister Winston Churchill declared today that "not only German U-boats but battle cruisers have crossed to the American side of the Atlantic and succeeded in sinking British ships. At the same time he announced the "certain destruction" yesterday of three German submarines in the continuing Battle of the Atlantic—which he described as "one of the most momentous ever fought in all the annals of war."

The prime minister spoke at a Pictorial luncheon at which he introduced John G. Winant, United States ambassador to Britain who promised the British ships, planes and submarines "with the utmost speed, in the greatest volume and with all the skill" at the command of the American people.

Reference Not Clear
Churchill's reference to submarines and battle cruisers did not make clear whether the wood-burning steers apparently caused the fire.

United States government yesterday said that a German submarine was heading toward the western Atlantic to attack ships loaded with United States-manufactured supplies.

The prime minister said the German warships had sunk vessels as far west as the 42nd meridian, on the American side of the Atlantic.

Churchill said that the United States government yesterday sent the legislation to the House of Representatives which would bring about "the ultimate downfall" of all dictators.

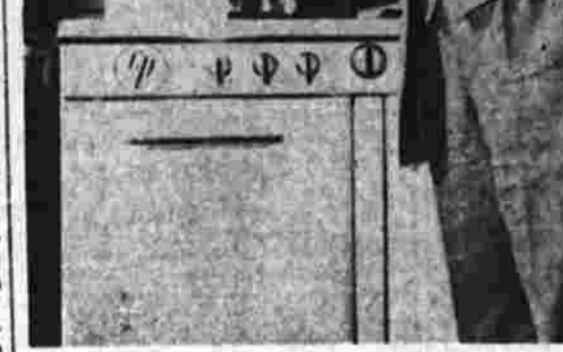
