Flame-Thrower Gives Carbon Monoxide Gas

The oil is a mixture of tars, hydrocarbons that blaze easily. creosote and other chemicals. They are decidedly smoky, a fact useful for hiding the flame-thrower when necessary, and accounting for some of the lethal effect when the stream enters a closed room, bunker or

Most Lethal of Gases

Carbon monoxide, forming as a result of incomplete combustion of the oil droplets where they strike, is the most lethal of the gases.

Reduction of oxygen of the air also is dangerous.

Both the carbon monoxide, however, and the oxygenless air, are effective only in closed spaces.

of the oil burned inside the tanks, the poisonous fumes attacking the fighters, while the low oxygen deprived the motors of a proper mixture and either slowed the speed of the stricken tanks, or actually stopped some of them. These results were enhanced by fiaming oil coating the exterior of the tanks.

Useful In Special Operations
The military article concedes that fiame-throwing tanks cannot always get within effective range. But it claims that both for tanks and for foot-soldlers carrying portable fiame-throwers, there are many special operations which can be planned effectively.

Capture of some supposedly impregnable forts was evidently accomplished in part by aid of fiame-throwers. Sometimes one or more throwers got close enough to project fiames, gases and amokes through breaches in walls. Sometimes the throwers, unable to do this, laid down smoke screens under cover of which supporting troops crept up.

The article says the fiame-throwers all are constructed on similar principles. There is one tank containing the oil, and a second filled with gas under pressure gas, since it is non-fiammable, and safe.

The nitrogen forces the oil out of the noazle at high speed. This pressure has to be gauged according to the diameter of the nozle, for two much pressure would make a useless spray instead of a lethal, almost solid stream.
