

State to Collect Auto Taxes Plan Ordered Studied

Senate Told 58,000 Motorists Sought to Evade Taxes Last Year; Bill Reported Unfavorably By Finance Group; 'Home Rule' Seen Hit.

State Capitol, Hartford, March 19.—(AP)—Told that 58,000 motorists last year sought to evade property taxes on their automobiles and that half of them succeeded, the Senate today ordered its Finance Committee to study further a proposal to transfer collection of the levies from municipalities to the state.

The bill, unfavorably reported by the committee, proposed that the State Motor Vehicle Department return 98 per cent of the tax receipts to the towns.

It originally set a 35 mill tax, but an amendment was offered providing that the levy be no higher than the rate prevailing in the municipality in which the car owner resides.

Collection Cost \$20,000

Senator Herbert E. Baldwin (R., Westport), asserted that the measure would provide "100 per cent" of the tax, which he said 58,000 motorists last year sought to evade. He cost the Motor Vehicle Department, which now steps in after a town fails to make collection, \$20,000 to catch up with half of the delinquencies, Baldwin said.

Explaining the finance committee's unfavorable report, Chairman Michael V. Blansfield (D., Waterbury) contended that "towns would lose considerable revenue and that 'centralization of authority in Hartford would interfere with home rule.'"

Another Finance committee member, Senator Clarence F. Baldwin (R., of Woodbridge), told the Senate that the state motor vehicle commissioner had estimated it would cost his department \$100,000 annually to administer the plan. Baldwin questioned whether that cost could be offset by the collection of levies from car owners who now evade the property tax.

The Woodbridge senator asserted that the tax would be discriminatory, contending that in effect, unlike owners of other types of property, the car owner would be required to pay his tax before he could use his property.

In the closing moments of the one-hour debate, Blansfield said that at least 100 additional clerks would be needed to administer the plan.

Balkans Close To Showdown On War Stand

Germans Report Yugoslavians Will Cut Her Lot With Rome - Berlin - Tokyo Lineup Mar. 26.

Belgrade, Yugoslavia, March 19.—(AP)—The war-irritated Balkans, hoping for the best but fearing the worst, edged nearer a showdown in the British-Axis diplomatic struggle today with a German report that Yugoslavians would cut her lot with the Rome-Berlin-Tokyo line-up.

German circles here circulated this report following a 30-minute meeting between German Minister Viktor Von Heeren and Yugoslav Foreign Minister Aleksandar Cincar-Markovic.

Furthermore, these quarters said the signing would be witnessed by Japanese Foreign Minister Yosuke Matsuoka, now on route to Rome and Berlin for Axis conferences.

To Center with Allies

The German-Yugoslav negotiations were watched at the other end of the Balkans by reliable reports that Foreign Minister Bisku Saracoglu of Turkey had returned to his post in Ankara. He was believed to be en route to Egypt to confer with British officials.

Turks' Reply Given Hitler

Berlin Forces Fail to Disclose Whether Contents to Be Printed.

Berlin, March 19.—(AP)—Turkish President Ismet Inönü's reply to a communication from Adolf Hitler has been delivered to the Fuehrer, authorized sources said today, but it was not disclosed whether the contents would be published.

(Hitler's message to Inönü, reported by Turkish quarters to have been an offer that Germany look out for Turkey's interests in reshaping of southeastern Europe was delivered at Ankara March 6.)

No Change in Relations

A spokesman said that reports on British landings in Greece were still followed with interest in Germany. He added that there had been no change in normal diplomatic relations between Berlin and Athens.

It was disclosed that Japanese Foreign Minister Yosuke Matsuoka's arrival in Berlin is expected next week—perhaps March 27, Japanese sources said.

Analysts here press predictions that four more nations would join the Axis pact, the spokesman commented.

"I know of only one," he said, "and that is the nation that has been exerting pressure on Yugoslavia to sign."

The spokesman added as an afterthought:

"Are there four nations left anyway?"

Following New Dealism

Questioned as to whether reports that Yugoslavians are mobilizing were considered significant, the spokesman said:

"Certainly I know of nothing unusual about that. Neutral Switzerland is mobilized. Now come reports that America is mobilizing—against one German U-boat."

British Mass Huge Forces Near Cheren

Italians Report Series of Attacks in Sector Repulsed with Heavy Losses; Battle Fierce.

Rome, March 19.—(AP)—The Italian high command reported today the British were massing strong land and air forces on the Cheren front in Eritrea, where a fierce battle has been under way several days.

A series of attacks by British forces in this sector yesterday, however, were repulsed with heavy losses, the daily communique said.

Italian troops were said to have counter-attacked after throwing back the British assaults, but the war bulletin made no mention of any change in the battle lines.

Destroy Eight Italian Fighter Planes

A formation of British fighters was credited with destroying eight Italian fighters in an attack on a British air base in East Africa.

Italian planes also were reported to have bombed British mechanized units and troops in North Africa.

Bad weather, marked by high winds and heavy fog, has forced the Italian high command to curtail attacks upon Greek positions in Albania, official Italian news agency said today.

Attack Greek Airfield

A night attack was made on the Greek airfield at Ioannina, the news agency said, but otherwise there were no aerial operations.

The daily communique of the Italian high command said merely: "On the Greek front, there was nothing noteworthy to report."

Would Probe Data Source

Wheeler Calls for Senate Investigation of Submarine Story Sources.

Washington, March 19.—(AP)—The reported threat of German U-boat operations off the North Atlantic coast brought a call today for a Senate investigation and kept a controversy going on the question of American convoys.

Pooh-poohing the submarine reports as "British propaganda," Senator Wheeler (D., Mont.) said that the Senate should authorize a special committee to look into the source of such information.

"If something should happen to some American vessel," he told reporters, "it would immediately be claimed that it was this German submarine that caused the trouble."

He said it was "extremely significant" that the administration favored investigating all foreign propaganda, except British.

House Defeats Plan To Make Reduction In British Aid Fund

Germans Aver At Least Six Vessels Sunk

Help Sought On Blocking Nazi Goods

Britain Starts Drive to Keep Food, War Materials Out of German Hands; Mission of Hull

Amendment to Cut Expenditure for Ammunition and Ordnance Beaten by Vote of 162 To 63 in First Test of Series to Make Overall Slash of \$2,000,000 in Spending.

Washington, March 19.—(AP)—In the first test on the \$7,000,000,000 British aid appropriation bill, the House defeated today an amendment by Representative Lamberston (R., Kans.), to make a \$585,714,186 reduction in a proposed \$1,343,000,000 expenditure for ordnance and ammunition. The amendment, announced as the first of a series to make overall cuts of \$2,000,000,000 in the big measure, was defeated by a standing vote of 162 to 63.

Lamberston asserted that \$5,000,000,000 would be adequate to put the program in operation and that the reduction could be applied easily to other government obligations.

But Representative Powers (R., N. J.) countered with the statement that if the \$7,000,000,000 were slashed, other bills would be presented to make up the cuts.

Decide On Last-Ditch Fight

A small opposition band of House Republicans, expressing belief that all-out British aid be continued for the United States, decided today to slash the big \$7,000,000,000 loan-lend appropriation before a final vote sends the bill to the Senate.

Announcing this "standstill" vote, the face of concealed overbalancing administration strength, Representative Lamberston (R., Kans.) charged that President Roosevelt was "entirely" a "loyal slave" to the "British" and that he was "coming a war president of the United States."

This threat of determined resistance failed to arouse concern among the voting Republicans. As the hour for voting approached, leaders of both parties predicted.

Ready to Act To Eliminate Labor Delays

Roosevelt Expected to Issue Order Establishing Federal Mediation Board Before Trip.

The Federal government was reported today to take definite steps toward eliminating strikes delays in the production of defense equipment.

Before leaving for a southern vacation, President Roosevelt was expected to issue an executive order establishing a federal mediation board which would adjust labor and management together to adjust their differences.

The War Department, determined to get construction under way again at the Army Air Corps experimental laboratories at Wright Field, Ohio, was reported by a spokesman to be considering the possibility of taking the \$900,000 building program into its own hands if a strike there is not settled quickly.

Naval Experts Now in Orient

Balkans Close To Showdown On War Stand

British Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden. Diplomatic messages reaching Belgrade said the British are preparing American-made planes to day in Greece for the anticipated battle of the Balkans.

Has Stiffened Attitude

At the same time, Turkish Foreign Minister Sukru Samanoglu reported at Ankara to have come to Palestine or Egypt for new talks with British Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden.

There was no indication of the bearing these talks might have on the Balkans.

Ready to Act To Eliminate Labor Delays

Senator Russell (D., Ga.), leader in this and three successful proposals for increasing the parity payments, said he would offer a \$218,000,000 amendment to the annual farm bill to make possible the additional payments.

"The last Congress can do as much for the farmer as it can for the city dweller," he said.

Washington, March 18.—(AP)—A powerful group of farm-oriented Senators lined up today behind a proposal for increasing the agricultural parity payment program to \$450,000,000, more than double the \$212,000,000 already voted by the House.

Senator Russell (D., Ga.), leader in this and three successful proposals for increasing the parity payments, said he would offer a \$218,000,000 amendment to the annual farm bill to make possible the additional payments.

"The last Congress can do as much for the farmer as it can for the city dweller," he said.

Reminded of Conflicts In Other Lands as They Gaze on Floral Beauty; Some Features Get Practice In Organizing

Manchester people who have attended the big Boston and New York flower shows which opened Monday at noon in both cities, were reminded of the war now raging on many fronts. At the Boston show the "wishing well" in the center of the beautiful rose garden in Mechanics hall is the replica of the well which was dropped in by the Germans making wishes according to tradition, the proceeds given to war relief organizations. Monday they were for Finland, yesterday they were for Norway's turn. Friday, Britain and Saturday, France.

At the International show in the Grand Central Palace, New York City, in an air raid shelter with vegetables growing on its roof and vines on its sides, the plants were on top and sides of air raid shelters, to provide food for the city and suburbs. A "Home and Defense" garden shows the American city and suburban areas may grow great rows of lettuce, beet, chard and other vegetables.

Also at the New York show are Pan-American gardens with exotic tropical plants and foliage. One pinkish white rose is planted in a garden with patches of orange, cream and bright blue between the center fountain and the borders. An unusual display at this show is one of plants which are in the Bible, labels giving the name and history, such as Cedar of Lebanon, hyacinth, Crown of Thorns, Bulrushes of the type among which Pharaoh's daughter found the infant Moses. There are 1,300 varieties of orchids shown, more than 70 species of ivy, many brand new flowers, such as the new, clear red "Katie Smith" sweet pea, and all the lovely favorites too numerous to list here.

At Boston Show

The great spectacle at the Boston show is the Australian, hillside and glen which fills one end of the hall space, with its tumbling cataract and brook, and its wealth of azalea trees with their glorious little round long yellow blossoms and full grown eucalyptus trees. Both natives of Australia, Egypt and other warm countries, they are successfully grown in California and the yellow blossoms are much used for bouquets all over the United States. With the aid of painted scenery showing mountain peaks, and lighting arrangements the effect is beautiful and realistic beyond description.

Organic Botanical

A group of Manchester women yesterday afternoon gathered at 3:30 and again at 4:30 to listen to the organ recitals in the main hall and on the Australian scene and the mammoth rose garden nearby filling the floor.

Can Start Food on Way To Britain in Few Hours

Arrangements for the transfer of food to the British will be made only a few hours today, to start assembling food supplies for shipment to Great Britain.

When the order comes through, it was explained, all the British Marketing Administration will have to do is to increase the food orders constantly being issued for domestic relief distribution purposes.

A detailed program for supplying Britain with essential foods was expected in a few days. President Roosevelt disclosed at his press conference yesterday that he had assigned the problem to Secretary of Agriculture Wickard and Dr. Thomas Farran, head of the Public Health Service.

First food shipments to Britain are expected by the Agriculture Department to include pork, lamb, evaporated and dried milk, cheese, powdered eggs, dried fruits, fruit juices, and dried vegetables—all products said to be most needed.

Farm officials said they were believing that the expected 1941 crop production coupled with existing surplus stocks would be ample to supply domestic needs as well as those of Great Britain and any other possible recipients of American food aid.
