Appeals Board Sets Hearing

Mortuary Case Again Up - To Be Decided on April 3, Board Asserts.

The problem of a petition asking for the right to apply for a permit to operate a gasoline filling station at 426 Hartford road, filed some weeks ago by Mortuary Brothers, must again come before the Zoning Board of Appeals. It was announced today, a public hearing on this question has been set for April 3 at eight o'clock in the municipal building.

The cause for a new hearing in this case is stated to be due to lack of the complete advertising required by zoning regulations in connection with public hearings. For this reason, permission previously granted Mortuary Brothers has been revoked.

About a year ago Walter Van Wagner, who then operated the gas station at the Hartford road location, asked the right to secure a permit for a second similar business which he planned to open nearby across the street from his location, the latter a rented site. Permission then was denied him due to several factors including traffic hazards. He was required to close his business on the rented site in order to gain rights on the location across the street.

Since that time the opinion of the Appeals Board apparently has changed, for last month, on application of a competing gas station business operated by Mortuary Brothers, the Zoning group granted them the right to open Van Wagner's former stand.

At the hearing held in connection with that decision, Van Wagner, represented by Attorney Jay E. Rubinow, opposed the issuance of permission to Mortuary Brothers to get a license.

When the Appeals Board granted Mortuary Brothers the desired permission, Van Wagner decided to appeal to the Superior Court for a reversal of the Appeals Board's decision.

Not Admitted: One of the complaints on his part concerned the fact that the hearing on the question had not been properly advertised. It is required that hearings of this nature be advertised three times, the last time at least seven days previous to the hearing. The revocation of the permission granted, together with the call for a new hearing again raises the question. It is not known if the Board will alter its previous decision on the question. Also on April 3, public hearings will be held on petitions of Mrs. Louise I. Kobis who wishes to convert part of a duplex house at 105 Ridge street into two apartments in a residence B zone, and John Jensen wishing to use property at East Center and Pilsen streets, now in an A residence zone, for business purposes.
