





All facilities of the latest types are furnished by the army to make this community, self-sustaining. There are water systems, electrical, and telephone systems, police service, fire departments, moving picture theaters, and sewer systems.

The men live in canvas tents of the pyramid type set upon wooden floors and sidings with screening on four sides. Each tent is wired with electricity and is furnished with small cone-shaped stoves in which sort coal is burned to heat the tents. Board walks are being constructed on all company streets.

The meas halls are roomy well lighted buildings furnished with the lastest equipment.
