

At the moment this country, alone, probably would encounter trouble in any military move to make the Monroe Doctrine stick. The United States hasn't, as yet, a military establishment big enough to cope with a large-scale assault on one or more points on the South American continent.

Canal Lightly Defended.

Even the Panama Canal is, as yet, lightly defended.

"Penetration" by a non-hemisphere power in South America would depend, of course, on the tide of world events and the course of the European war. For many years the existence of the British

Would European airlines operating in South America provide a ready avenue of military penetration?
