The normal day force approximates 6,000. At headquarters of the striking CIO United Automobile Workers Union, Local 248, it was reported "less than 100" went back to work this morning.

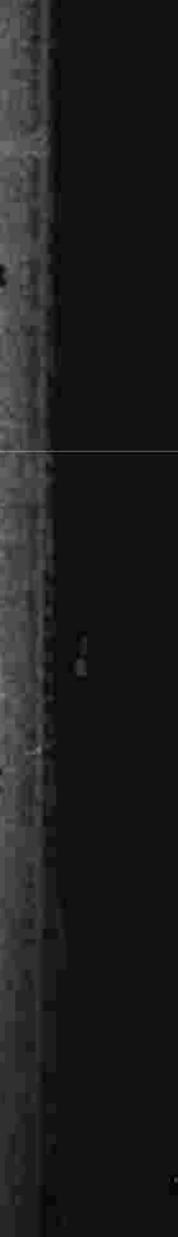
