Ford and Strikers Ready to Mediate; Fighting Renewed

Detroit, April 3.—(AP)—Gov. Murray D. Van Wageningen announced today that "the foundation has been laid for successful mediation" of the strike that has closed the giant Ford Motor Company's Rouge plant, largest single factory unit in the world. "Both the company and union officials have made definite and binding commitments to me to meet certain basic requirements for mediation," the governor declared in a formal press statement.

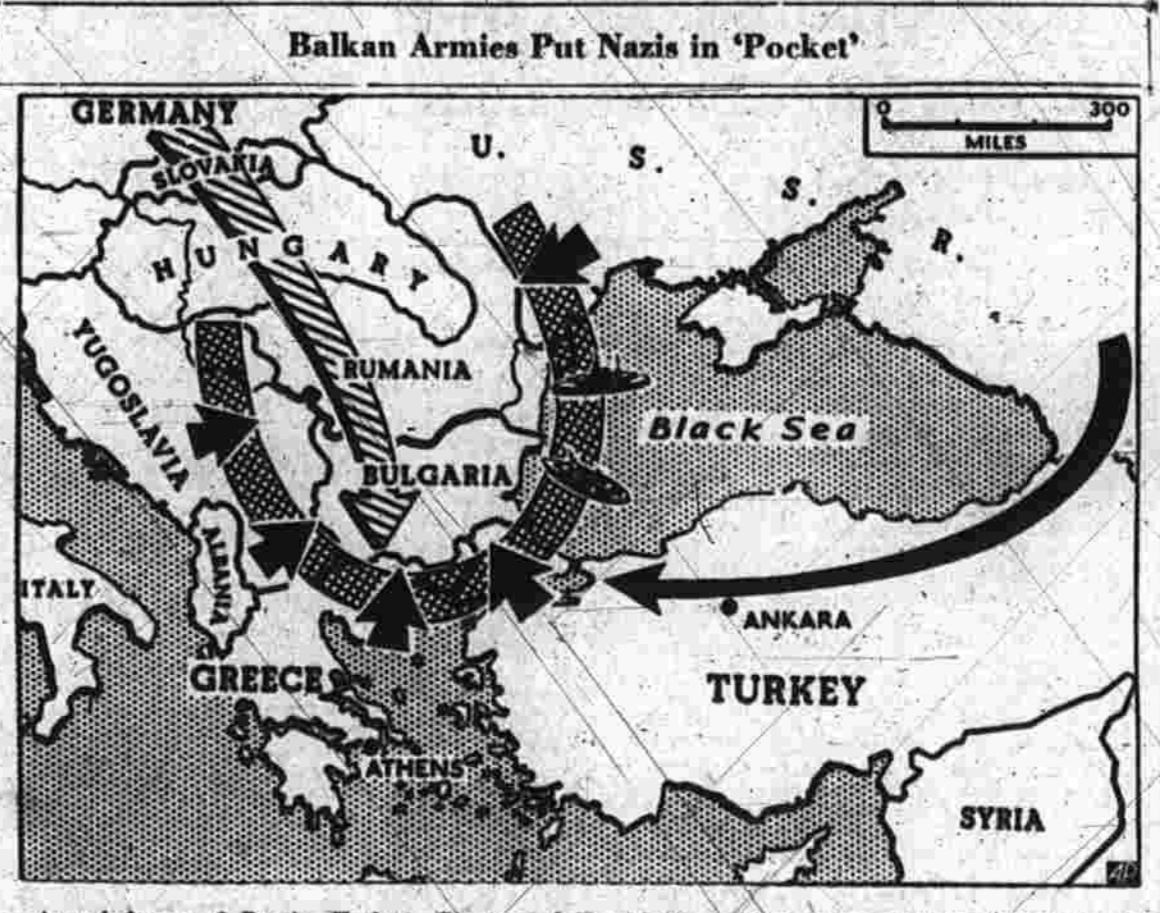
The governor's statement was made as operations at the great Ford Rouge plant, employing more than 85,000 hourly rated workers were at a standstill and renewed but isolated outbreaks of fighting occurred near the castle long factory in suburban Dearborn.

The strike called by the United Automobile Workers, (CIO) and the Ford company officials, the governor said, "gave me their word that they will not try to reopen the plants while mediation is in progress."

Belgrade, Yugoslavia, April 3.—(AP)—Germany ordered all of her legation staff save two men home to Berlin today in a flurry of ominous military activity and diplomatic circles expressed belief that Adolf Hitler had decided that war with Yugoslavia was inevitable. Only the German chargé d'affaires and military attaché were exempted from the recall order, which a legation secretary said would be fulfilled by nightfall.

Motivated German troops were reported marching in the regular post to the Yugoslav frontier town of Bela Crkva, only 50 miles from Belgrade, and at Szeged in southern Hungary.
