## Obtain Subpoenas For Fords in Try To Combat Order

### Attorneys for Strikers Make Move to Fight Federal Injunction Forbidding Members Interfering with Employees at Rouge Plant.

Detroit, April 4.—(AP)—Charging that union men were being roughly treated by "roving bands of thugs, armed with iron bars," the United Automobile Workers' Union (CIO) threatened today to withdraw maintenance men it had agreed to have enter the struck-houm Ford Motor Co. plant at River Rouge.

Detroit, April 4.—(AP)—Attorneys for striking CIO unionists who have closed the Ford Motor Company's Rouge plant obtained subpoenas for Henry and Edsel Ford this morning in a move to combat a Federal restraining order obtained by the company. The court order forbade members of the United Automobile Workers (CIO) from interfering with Ford employees entering or leaving the plant.

James F. Dewey, representative of the United States Conciliation Service, announced that plans are under way to evacuate the Negro who have been inside the plant since the strike started Tuesday night. He said he did not know how many there were but hazarded the opinion there were 700 or 800. Unofficial estimates have run as high as 5,000.

Ernest Goodman, attorney who obtained subpoenas for the founder and president of the company and also for Harry E. Bennett, Ford personnel director, said that he intended to show the affiliation between the Ford Company and Fascist governments.

Goodman obtained his subpoenas after United States District Judge Arthur J. Tuttle, who issued the restraining order last night, refused to accept an oral motion for dismissal of it. The attorney said filing of a written motion would depend on "when we can get service of the subpoenas."

## British Bomb Brest During Night Attack

London, April 4.—(AP)—A strong British Air Force unit last night bombed the French port of Brest, where the German battleships *Scharnhorst* and *Gneisenau* are sheltering, and also attacked oil tanks at Rotterdam and docks at Ostend, the Air Ministry reported today.

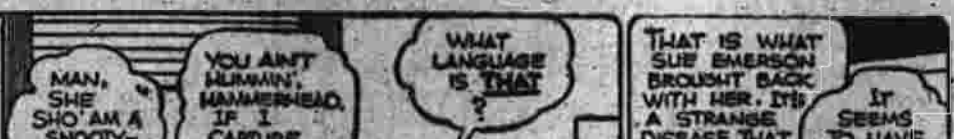

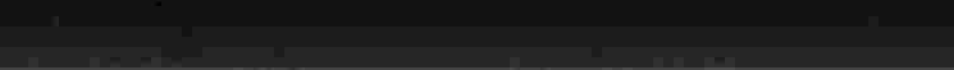

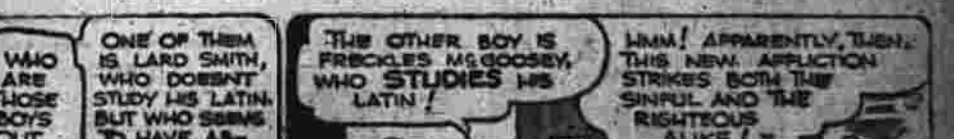
