Expect Defense Heads Will Press for Speed

Washington, April 8.—Defense chiefs were expected today to put on pressure for speed and more speed in preparing America's defenses after word from President Roosevelt that there still was room for an awful lot of improvement.

Thousands of Reasons. Questioned as to why the program was going along too slowly, he said there were thousands of reasons—individuals, mostly human beings.

Secretary Ickes says the government plant at Amarillo, Tex. is simply safe and eager to provide all the gas needed for national defense. Congress gave him authority to forbid exports in quantities sufficient for military purposes.

Rest Admiral J. H. Towers, U. S. N. Bureau of Aeronautics, says the new airships would be excellent for military purposes. He will carry two-way radio communication but without radar.

For bases, stations, and fortifications, he said he had told certain groups from states having cold climates why they should not be located in their communities and that he had understood, without access to raw materials and supply of skilled labor also were factors dictating placement of facilities, he said.

None of the total output of \$1,800,000,000, which included still other categories, was British orders, he said.

He agreed with a recent statement by John D. Biggers, OP44 production chief, that the next 100 days would be precious in the all-out defense and aid programs. Mr. Roosevelt added that the next 100 days after that also would be crucial ones.

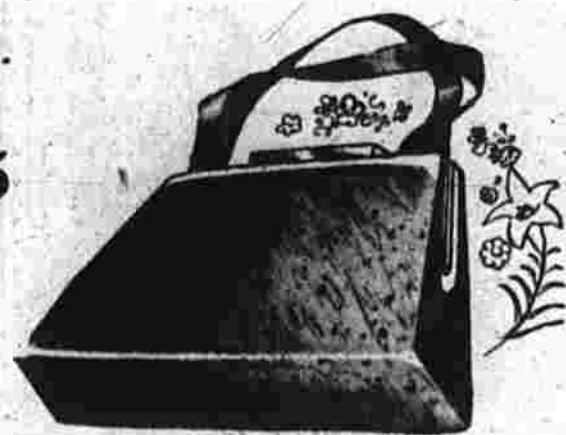
