## Greeks Report Their Army Yet Intact; Nazis Claim 80,000 Taken Prisoners

### Roosevelt Seeking Authority to Use Foreigners' Ships

Washington, April 10.—(P)—President Roosevelt asked Congress today for broad statutory authority to take over any "foreign-owned vessels lying idle in our ports." This authority, he said in a message to the legislators, should be subject to the payment of just compensation. Although the chief executive had asserted Tuesday that he would recommend legislation to permit the purchase or charter of 30 Danish vessels which have been taken into "protective custody" by the Coast Guard, the language of his message today was not limited to the Danish ships.

### Washington Daybook

Second of two articles on what is in Washington and how to see it.

Washington—Without a worry about nickels and dimes, you probably can get as much for your money here as anywhere. The District of Columbia is no land of milk and honey, but Congress has put a stoppage on some of the common racketeering which drains the tourists of their dollars.
