

Staunton, Va., April 10 .- (P) Amid the tumult of another war in Europe, plans are quietly being made to dedicate the birthplace of Woodrow Wilson as a national

Many notables have joined in what President Roosevelt has described as the "patriotic service" of restoring the birthplace.

"The birthplace of this great American should by all means be added to the shrines which Americans revere," the president has written to Mrs. Cordell Hull, president of the Woodrow Wilson Birthplace Foundation, Inc.

"It is a place which will increase in sentimental and historic interest as the decades pass and all lovers of history and historic associations will be your debtors for the constructive effort you and your associates are putting forward in preserving this American home from the hazards of time." Ceremonies On May 4

The ceremonies will be May 4— 24 years after the United States' entrance into a war President Wilson hoped would "make the world itself at last free."

Wilson was born here Dec. 28, 1856, the son of Dr. Joseph Rug-gles Wilson and Janet Woodrow Wilson His birthplace became a chapel of Mary Baldwin College but it was purchased in 1938 by funds raised by the state of Virginia and Mrs. Wilson, and passed into possession of the foundation.
