Herald Wins First In Class for Ayer Typography Award

Given First Honorable Mention for Excellence From Among Newspapers of Country of Under 10,000 Circulation; 575 in Contest.

The Herald has been adjudged first in its class of newspapers of less than 10,000 circulation from among a total of 1,038 entries in the 11th Annual Exhibition of Newspaper Typography conducted by N. W. Ayer & Son, Inc., the country's leading advertising agency, it was announced today.

Entries were received for the exhibition from all over the United States. In the class in which the Herald was adjudged the winner there were 575 entries.

The New York Herald-Tribune was awarded the highest recognition, being the best newspaper in the country, typographically. The exhibition was open to all English-language dailies in the United States. The awards are made on the basis of excellence in typography, make-up and presswork.

In last year's contest the Herald was among the finalists but was not cited for an award. This year the Herald goes to the top of newspapers throughout the country in its circulation class.

Rolling Attack Made by Nazis At Birmingham

Raiders Numbering Several Hundred Blasted City and Other Targets in Night Assault.

Berlin, April 11.—(AP)—Left-wing raiders numbering "several hundred" blasted Birmingham and other targets in central and southern England in rolling attacks lasting several hours, the German high command announced today.

"The effects of the raid were obvious," a war bulletin said. "Good visibility permitted observation of numerous conflagrations."

The high command said other Nazi air units striking at British shipping, sank a 5,000-ton merchant ship with a direct hit about 124 miles west of the Hebrides and damaged another large vessel northwest of the Shetlands.

Two Midland Cities Chief Nazi Target

Covertry, Birmingham Attacked in Raids in Which Damage Heavy and Casualties Many.

London, April 11.—(AP)—Covertry and Birmingham were among the places attacked by German bombers last night in raids which the British government acknowledged had caused considerable damage and probably heavy casualties.

It was the second raid on Birmingham, big Midlands industrial center, in as many nights. Covertry, still recovering from a devastating raid last Nov. 14, was bombed heavily Tuesday night.

The Birmingham damage included explosive or free bomb hits on a movie theater and three air raid warden posts. The British reported their night fighters had destroyed nine of the Nazi raiders, which also kept London under alert for five hours and shodded at the south coast. General Motors Given Notice Strike Looms

Union Workers Plan to Walk Out If New Contract Labor Agency Told.

Detroit, April 11.—(AP)—Gov. Murray D. Van Wagener announced today that officials of The Ford Motor Company and the United Automobile Workers (CIO) had reached an agreement settling the 10-day strike at the Rouge plant.

The Federal Labor Department said today that it had received word from the General Motors Corporation that the CIO United Auto Workers Union had served notice of intention to strike if a new wage agreement was not negotiated before April 20.

A shutdown of General Motors would affect about 120,000 workers. The firm has millions of dollars worth of defense contracts. The Labor Department immediately assigned a conciliator to try to prevent a work stoppage.

Negotiations on contract revisions began March 21. Union demands announced at that time included: A general wage increase of 10 cents an hour; 40 hours vacation pay instead of 40; a new system for handling grievances; adequate compensation for drafted workers; and additional authority for the impartial umpire to rule on issues on which an agreement cannot be reached. Powder Plant Blast Kills 2

Undetermined Number Hurt at Hercules Cotton Dehydration House.

Belvidere, N. J., April 11.—(AP)—An explosion in the cotton dehydration house of Hercules Powder Company's smokeloss powder plant here today caused two deaths and injured four other employees.

Although the company headquarters at Wilmington, Del., at first announced two had been killed, a later statement said there had been only one death. The company said no workers were missing.

The Wilmington, Del., headquarters of the powder company also announced that "property damage was slight and confined to one building." One of the injured, Charles Hays, 21, of Belvidere, died in a hospital in Philadelphia, N. J. It could not be established immediately whether he was one of the two dead listed by the company as a third victim.

Magyar Army Acts to Take Yugoslav Area

Hungarians Seek to Reclaim Region Lost in World War; Cross Border at Two Points.

Budapest, Hungary, April 11.—(AP)—The Hungarian Army has marched into Yugoslavia to reclaim territory lost in the World War.

An Army report said Magyar troops had crossed the Tricon frontier between the Danube and Tisza rivers, as well as in the triangle in Baranya between the Danube and Drava rivers.

The Hungarian nation was informed of this step, said yesterday, with publication in morning papers today of a proclamation of Regent Admiral Nicholas Horthy. "Yugoslavia Left Dissolved"

The proclamation said formation of an independent Croatian state in the north left Yugoslavia "dissolved into several parts."

This act left Hungary the "dirty" to take again in our own hands the care for Hungarians living in the territories stolen from us, said.

Under the Treaty of Trianon in 1920 Hungary lost perhaps 500,000 of her Magyar population to Yugoslavia in the Banat, Baranya, Medjumurje regions.

"This was a national duty which we had to fulfill today," Horthy's proclamation blared. "Therefore, I give today (Thursday) the order to my soldiers to defend Hungarian living in the Banat, Baranya, Medjumurje regions."

Nazis Take Yanitza; Threaten Left Wing; Yugoslavs Destroyed

Nazi Advance in North Determined; Crush Several Yugoslav Divisions in Center; 10,000 Prisoners Taken On Central Front; Surrender of East Greek Army 'On Schedule'.

Berlin, April 11.—(AP)—Authorized German quarters declared today the Yugoslav Army is being "systematically wiped up or even blotted out" as the high command told of the total destruction of Serb forces in the south, a determined German advance in the north and the crushing of several Yugoslav divisions in the center. Ten thousand new prisoners were reported taken on the central front.

A subsequent announcement broadcast by the official Berlin radio said that a previous Yugoslav report of 20,000 prisoners in southern Yugoslavia had been doubled, thus making the total claim of prisoners captured 40,000.

About the fighting which led to the annihilation of the enemy forces in south Serbia by the German troops, we have just learned that the number of prisoners has been doubled, that it increased to 40,000 and the booty amounts to 200 guns in all. The announcement, as transcribed in New York by CBS.

"Surrender 'on Schedule'" The surrender of the eastern Greek Army, pinched off when the blitzkrieg struck to Salonika, is "proceeding on schedule," the high command said, and "the number of prisoners and the amount of booty still cannot be estimated."

The daily communique said crossings of the Drava river in northern Yugoslavia had been forced and troops under Col. Gen. Baron Von Weichs were pushing forward despite "difficult terrain and weather conditions" in an advance that has been under way since yesterday morning.

80 Axis Planes Toll for Week

Shot Down or Destroyed By Ground Staffing in North Africa War.

Cairo, Egypt, April 11.—(AP)—More than 80 Axis planes have been shot down or destroyed by ground staffing in North Africa during the past week, an R. A. F. statement said today.

It related details of an "amazing" two days' when 27 German aircraft were destroyed with the loss of one British Hurricane. On the first day of intensive aerial activity, 20 German dive bombers and their escorts, Messerschmitt 109s, were routed by Hurricanes, and five Junkers and three Messerschmitts were destroyed.

The following day was "even more successful" as 17 German aircraft were shot down by British fighters. Six Heinkels and two other aircraft were reported destroyed in a ground strafing expedition at Derma. An Australian fighter squadron had been an unfavorable reaction to the German attack. Germany Strike Toward Right Wing Anchor of British-Greek Main Defense Line; British Report Stiffening Resistance Against Nazis in Southern Yugoslavia Area Today.

Athens, April 11.—(AP)—British expeditionary troops have clashed with Adolf Hitler's blitzkrieg invaders for the first time in northern Greece, it was officially announced today, and the Battle of Greece apparently is developing. Striking toward the right wing anchor of the British-Greek main defense line, in the vicinity of fabled Mount Olympus, the Germans were reported to have captured Yanitza, 48 miles due north of the Olympus range.

Chief Naxos columns were reported trying to push through the mountain passes in southern Yugoslavia, threatening the British left wing in a drive toward Florina, Greece. Headquarters of the British Expeditionary Force reported stiffening resistance against the Germans in southern Yugoslavia where Nazi armored columns were said to be rolling southward from Priepol, Yugoslavia, toward Florina, northern Greece.

Insists Japan Acts Peaceful

Premier Says No Force Will Be Used in Realizing Her Ambitions.

Tokyo, April 11.—(AP)—Premier Fumimaro Konoye in a daily significant statement reported today Japan's southern policy was "purely economic and peaceful" and insisted that Japan would not use force to realize her ambitions.

Konoye, whose statement was made at a press conference with Japanese reporters, expressed optimistic regarding United States-Japanese relations.

Questions in Faith He acknowledged, however, that Japan's membership in the Berlin-Tokyo Axis and continuation of the China conflict were obstacles in the path of a completely amicable relationship between Tokyo and Washington.

"Do you think that United States-Japanese relations will not work?" he was asked. "I do not think so," the premier replied.

Konoye said Admiral Kichisaburo Nomura, ambassador to Washington, was trying to convince the United States government that Japan's entry into the Axis pact was peaceful and aimed at prevention of American participation in war.

Enemy Fleet Turned Back

Driven Off by Army After Attacking Four New England Points.

Boston, April 11.—(AP)—A theoretical enemy fleet was assumed to have been driven off after attacking four New England points as Army exercises were concluded today at First Corps Area headquarters.

The enemy vessels were supposed to have fanned out, striking with one cruiser at Portland, Me.; one at Portsmouth, N. H.; one at Boston; and one cruiser and two submarines at Newport, R. I.

Casualties were assumed to have been suffered by both sides. Actually, guns were silent, and no troops moved, but the army officers responsible for the industrial area's protection worked out complicated problems on paper under the direction of Gen. William H. Arnold, commander of the First Corps Area.
