Taxes Reveal Business Good
 Increase of \$1,576,418 in March Compared To 1940 Month.

Hartford, April 14.—(AP) Accelerated business conditions are reflected in state tax receipts last month, which show a \$1,576,418 increase as compared with March, 1940, State Tax Commissioner Charles J. McLaughlin reported today.

The greatest increase, Commissioner McLaughlin reported, was in the corporation business tax, which last month totaled \$1,264,450, as compared with March, 1940, when the return was \$1,012,222, an increase of \$252,228.

All categories of income tax carried motor bus tax showed increases, and this decrease was slight, \$2.15.

Increases reported in other divisions last month, as compared with March, 1940, are: Amusement, \$98,466; beverage, \$4,812; cigarettes, \$2,623; other unclassified business, \$108,693; inheritance, \$46,454.

Tide Gauges Offer New Long Range Forecasts

Fluctuations of Gulf Stream Change Sea Level Off Florida by Half Foot.

By Edward W. Blakelee

Washington, April 14.—(AP) Discover that the ocean tide gauges at Miami furnish long range weather forecasts for such places as Chicago and New York have been made at the Oceanographic Institution here.

The gauges show that mean sea level off Florida is changing by half a foot, over long periods, due to fluctuations in the Gulf Stream.

This mysterious ocean river, which off New York has 700 times the volume of the Mississippi in flood, is in turn controlled by the volume of the ocean.

These same winds make possible the long-range inland forecast. And their effects extend from the Arctic down into the tropics.

That they influenced weather has been known. But they were too vast to measure. The queer level fluctuations, however, an unexpected index of their movement, were measured by tide gauges off Florida, but off Charleston and other points.

Clarification of this forecasting has culminated in the last few months and is described by Columbus O'Brien, of the International Institute of Mining and Metallurgy.

It was established, first, that the Gulf Stream is really part of the great circulation of the entire North Atlantic. As the Gulf Stream flows northward, it is deflected by the Gulf of Mexico to flow clockwise up along the American coast.

It is in fact that the north, but the main flow turns southward under the name of the Canary current, along the west coast of Europe.

"Thus," said Mr. O'Brien, "we should expect some correlation between mean sea level at Miami and the monthly temperature at, for example, Chicago."

Protests Japan Seizing Gaoline

Shanghai, April 14.—(AP) The United States consulate general today protested against the seizure of 5,000 drums of American-owned gasoline from the British freighter Shanghai.

The gasoline was loaded by the Texas Oil Company for shipment to Rangoon, Burma, but was unloaded by the Japanese under the recent "embargo order" issued by the Japanese-sponsored Nanking regime.
